





Curricular Area	Details
<p data-bbox="97 125 309 192">Language and Literacy</p> 	<p><u>Spelling</u>: The children will learn new sounds, words and spelling rules on a weekly basis. The children will be tested on these on a Friday.</p> <p><u>Reading</u>: This term we will use our Oxford Reading Tree books and activities as well as looking at a range of non-fiction texts related to our class topics. We will also be developing our before, during and after reading strategies whilst reading our class novel, The Day the Screens Went Blank and through different comprehension passages.</p> <p><u>Writing</u>: This term we will be developing our skills in recount writing by increasing the amount of detail and introducing more ambitious vocabulary.</p> <p><u>Listening & Talking</u>: We will develop our listening and talking skills in a variety of ways including stories for thinking, sharing our news, discussions our thoughts and opinions to the stories hear in Newsround and discussions based around our class topics.</p> <p><u>French</u>: Mrs McLean will take Primary 5/4 for French on a Tuesday afternoon. I can't wait to see how the children improve as the session progresses.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 528 352 595">Mathematics and Numeracy</p> 	<p>This term we will develop our skills in place value up to tens of thousands, recognising zero as a place holder. We will continue to practise mental maths skills daily using flashcards, playing games, through song and Glasgow Counts strategies. In Maths we will develop our skills in both 2D and 3D shape. As well as this we will participate in Maths Week activities on the week beginning 27th September.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 703 316 770">Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)</p>	<p>Our topic this term is the local area where our focus will be on Shipbuilding on the Clyde. We will be looking at Social Studies. Literacy and Expressive Arts through our topic. In addition to this the children will carry out their own personal topic research making use of the non-fiction books from the school library.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 828 293 862">Social Studies</p>	<p>We will explore the history of the River Clyde and the important role it plays. We will look at the development and decline of the shipyards. As well as this we will learn about the jobs within the shipyards and learn about some of the famous vessels built in Glasgow over the years including the Waverly. We will also learn about the damage to the shipyards during the Second World War.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 987 229 1021">Sciences</p>	<p>This term we will be learning about energy sources and sustainability. The children will be made aware of different types of energy around them and will learn of their importance to everyday life and survival.</p>
 <p data-bbox="97 1149 288 1182">Technologies</p>	<p>This term we will be extending our knowledge of how to use digital technology to communicate with others in a safe and secure way. In addition to this we will be making use of the Sumdog and Showbie apps through weekly homework tasks.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 1189 331 1256">Religious and Moral Education</p>	<p>This term we will be learning about people's beliefs and values and how these affect their actions. We will relate this to our own school values happiness, kindness, positivity and respect.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 1281 256 1348">Health and Wellbeing</p> 	<p><u>PE</u>: The children will be working with Paul from Soccer 4's on football on a Tuesday morning. In addition to this Primary 5/4 will focus on team games on a Wednesday afternoon.</p> <p><u>HWB</u>: Pupils will learn about the different rights they have as a child. Following from this the children will create their own class promise, a set of class rules. In addition we will develop our understanding of the different emotions we feel and who they can talk to about these if they need help.</p>
<p data-bbox="97 1503 309 1536">Expressive Arts</p>	<p>Our art this term will be based around our topics. We will be focusing on line, shape, colour, pattern and texture to produce an accurate representation of real-life objects.</p>
