<p>Language and Literacy including French in P5-P7</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Class Novel – The Witches by Roald Dahl and Coraline by Neil Gaiman • Writing through Space topic – Apollo 11 Newspaper article, Imaginative stories, Acrostic poems, Fact files and Persuasive skills • Reading skills – discussing genres, visualising, predicting, asking and answering questions and making links between characters and events • Talking and Listening – listening and watching to identify information, describe feelings, and beginning to talk confidently in a group using supporting detail • Spelling rules, Grammar and Handwriting will be taught discretely 1 x per week <p>French will be taught weekly by Mrs Thompson.</p>

<p>Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)</p>	<p>Our IDL focus this term is Children’s Rights looking at all the articles within the UNCRC and discussing their place in our classroom, school and wider life.</p>
<p>Social Studies</p>	<p>We will work with Wilma from ASDA Govan on an enterprise topic that will look at food waste and supporting the needs within our local community.</p>
<p>Sciences</p>	<p>Our main topic is Space this term which was voted for by the class. We will look at our Solar System understanding the scale, size and motion within it building our knowledge of the moon, sun and universe. We will answer any big questions the children have!</p>
