Curricular Area	Details
Language and Literacy Mathematics and Numeracy	 We will continue to build on our reading skills using our reading books. Please remember to try to hear your child's reading at home every night! We are reading "The Dinosaur's Diary" by Julia Donaldson as our class novel this term. This will support our comprehension and will introduce us to Before, During and After reading strategies. Reading for pleasure is important to us and the children are encouraged to develop their own particular reading interests. They regularly have the opportunity to choose texts. Our main writing focus this term will be imaginative, and will require us to design interesting characters and settings. We will explore the features of the genre and will be writing three-part stories over the coming weeks. We will continue to develop our talking and listening skills through a range of weekly activities. We try to ensure we listen to others and can summarise what they have said, and will look at how to ask effective questions. We have started the term by exploring inverse operations. The children are learning to solve problems and then check their answer by using the opposite operation, and are creating 'fact families' of four sums. Our practice of times tables is ongoing and supports our division skills
3x+4y	 We will explore measuring mass, volume, length and area. With Mrs Thomson, we are developing our data handling skills and will be learning about different ways of collecting and presenting information.
Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)	This term we will be learning all about 'The World of Work!' We hope to inspire children by exploring different careers and the skills required, providing lots of opportunities for listening and talking, as well as touching on social studies as we develop our understanding of our role in society. Our second IDL this term will be 'Chocolate', in which we will examine Fairtrade and the journey of chocolate.
Social Studies	Through the above contexts, children will be exploring citizenship and people who help us in society. They will consider their own community and that of the wider world, with links to sustainability.
Sciences	In Science, we are growing our own chard and kale seeds, and this has allowed many opportunities to discuss life cycles, sustainability and food chains. Later in the term, we will be learning about processes of the planet, including a deeper look at the water cycle, and space, where we'll examine the earth, moon, sun and their relationships to one another.
Technologies	This term, P3 will continue developing their abilities to use ICT independently through the iPads. We will be learning to search for and save relevant information, as well as independence in logging on and accessing apps.
Religious and Moral Education	We will continue to promote tolerance, respect and understanding of all children's beliefs and religions. We will explore Sikhism and Hinduism as our focus religions this term, learning about their beliefs, artefacts and main celebrations.
Health and Wellbeing	Children will be learning about how to keep safe in an emergency and identify hazards in different environments. This term, they will also complete RSHP lessons. These will include how to keep their bodies clean, how all families may look different, feelings and safety, and similarity, diversity and respect. In P.E., we are developing our ball skills and will be learning to play tennis.
Expressive Arts	As part of our 'World of Work' topic the children will participate in creating a short drama using improvisation and hot-seating. They will be encouraged to convey a character using their voice, expression and body language, and to answer questions as that character.
