| Interdisciplinary <br> Learning (IDL) | This term we will be participating in an enterprise topic. The children will work in small teams to create a business, designing keyrings to sell to children in school. They will be covering various aspects of the curriculum through this topic including Literacy, Expressive Arts, Numeracy and Social Studies. |
| Social Studies | Through the enterprise topic the children will be running their very own business, becoming young entrepreneurs. They will be developing skills in budgeting, planning, designing, manufacturing and selling. |
| Sciences | In Science, we will be learning to understand that electricity is a form of energy that is used to make things work, such as creating light, heat, sound and movement. The children will also learn that electricity is the flow of electrons and that the flow of electricity is called a current and it travels around circuits. The children will have the opportunity to build simple circuits containing bulbs, switches, bells and batteries. |
| Technologies $\rightarrow$ | This term, P4 will continue developing their abilities to use ICT independently through the iPads. We will be using Book Creator to create a book with text, images and videos while encouraging independence in logging on and accessing apps. |
| Religious and Moral Education | Mrs Thomson will be leading weekly RME lessons this term. The children will be exploring Bible stories such as The Good Samaritan, The Lost Sheep and The Prodigal Son. We will also be visiting Ibrox Parish Church to hear the minister talk about one of her favourite stories from the Bible. |
| Health and Wellbeing | This term P4 will be covering the RSHP lessons. They will learn how friendships are formed and that likes and dislikes can influence relationships. They will identify positive things about friendships and relationships and know who they should talk to when something worries or upsets them. The children will also become aware of how their bodies grow and learn the correct names for its different parts and how they work. They will also be learning about where living things come from and about how they grow, develop and are nurtured. |
| Expressive Arts | As part of RME, the children will participate in creating a short drama using improvisation. They will retell the Bible stories using voice, expression, action and movement to convey the role they are playing. |
