





Curricular Area	Details
<p data-bbox="86 120 284 174">Language and Literacy</p> 	<p data-bbox="304 120 1497 174">Spelling: The children will continue to learn new sounds, words and spelling rules on a weekly basis. The children will be tested on these on a Friday.</p> <p data-bbox="304 176 1497 264">Reading: We will continue to develop our skills through our class novel 'The Last Bear', non-fiction and fiction comprehension texts, cloze reading passages and of course our core reading books making use of the before, during and after reading strategies.</p> <p data-bbox="304 266 1497 409">Writing: This term we will be creating our own procedural writing by writing instructions and recipes. Pupils will learn about the key features needed. This will include using some bossy verbs and pupils will be encouraged to include adjectives, adverbs within their text. In addition to this, pupils will carry out various types of poetry writing including shape, acrostic and a senses poem based on our weather topic.</p> <p data-bbox="304 412 1497 499">Listening & Talking: Pupils will develop their confidence in talking and listening by reciting some well-known poems and some poem of their own demonstrating appropriate listening and talking techniques.</p> <p data-bbox="304 501 1497 524">French: Mrs McLean will continue to take Primary 5/4 for French on a Tuesday afternoon.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 530 284 584">Mathematics and Numeracy</p> 	<p data-bbox="304 530 1497 730">In Numeracy we will be learning different strategies to carry out multiplication and division problems demonstrating understanding of the commutative law. To help support pupils I would encourage that they continue to practise their times tables. In addition to this we will be carrying out work on fractions. Pupils should be able to explain what a fraction is, know the role of the numerator (top number) and denominator (bottom number) and compare and order fractions. We will continue with counting games and our flashcards and maths games will be used daily in lessons to develop our mental maths skills.</p> <p data-bbox="304 732 1497 853">In Maths we will explore time by telling the time, recording the time and date, making use of a calendar and learning the number of seconds in a minutes and minutes in an hour. In transformation where pupils will plot two figure grid references. This term Mrs Thompson will continue to take the children to carry out some problem-solving activities on a weekly basis.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 860 284 913">Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)</p>	<p data-bbox="304 860 1497 1003">We will be covering two class topics over the course of the term. Our first class topic this term is Scottish Food. Pupils should be able to describe the basic journey of food, for example, milk can come from a cow, bread comes from wheat, rye and oats. The second topic we will cover will be weather. Pupils will measure and record the weather and discuss how weather affects our daily lives. Through both of these topics we will be covering Literacy, Expressive Arts and Social Studies.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 1010 284 1039">Social Studies</p>	<p data-bbox="304 1010 1497 1086">Pupils will explore the variety of different foods produced in Scotland and will be able to discuss the importance of different types of agriculture in the production of these foods across Scotland and beyond.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 1093 284 1122">Sciences</p>	<p data-bbox="304 1093 1497 1214">In Science this term we will be investigating the human body. Pupils will be able to describe the position and function of the skeleton and major organs of the human body and discuss what is needed to do to keep them healthy. To enhance pupils understanding we will be visiting the Science Centre in February where pupils will take part in workshops based on the human body.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 1220 284 1249">Technologies</p> 	<p data-bbox="304 1220 1497 1386">We will make use of the Book Creator app this term to create a presentation of what pupils have learned. As well as this, pupils will learn about the importance of staying safe whilst being online and demonstrate their understanding of their rights and responsibilities as a digital citizen, understanding of the potential dangers online and who to go to for advice and who to report a concern to. Pupils should be able to explain the need for strong passwords. In addition to this, pupils will continue to make use of the Sumdog and Showbie apps through weekly homework tasks.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 1393 284 1469">Religious and Moral Education</p>	<p data-bbox="304 1393 1497 1469">In RME we will focus on the festivals of Eid-al-Fitr and Easter. We will make connections between the similarities of these and other world religions and learn how these relate to their own life and community they live in.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 1476 284 1529">Health and Wellbeing</p> 	<p data-bbox="304 1476 1497 1563">PE: For the first part of the term the children will be working to develop their fitness. They will work on improving their stamina, speed, flexibility and core strength. As well as this, the pupils will participate in a 5-week sports programme with the Glasgow School of Sport, Sports Leaders.</p> <p data-bbox="304 1565 1497 1664">HWB: Pupils this term will learn the importance of daily hygiene and routines eg hand washing. Pupils will also learn how to prepare, handle and store food safely. They will learn the importance of washing and drying both equipment and surfaces carefully whilst being able to follow a recipe.</p>
<p data-bbox="86 1671 284 1700">Expressive Arts</p>	<p data-bbox="304 1671 1497 1814">This term we will be carrying out some Scottish dance routines and creating some routines of our own. Pupils will become aware of the different features of dance and can practise and perform steps, formations, and a dance routine to others where they can respond by discussing their thoughts and feelings and give and accept constructive comment on their own and others' work. Pupils will also receive weekly CREATE music sessions with Mrs Thomas on a Friday afternoon.</p>
