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Curricular Area	Details
Language and Literacy	Reading- we will further develop our reading skills using the novel, 'Divided City'. Within the book, themes such as sectarianism, racism and diversity are addressed. We will also be performing The
	Wizard of Oz at the end of this term, and pupils will be developing skills in reading a play script. Pupils will be encouraged to independently research on their iPads throughout the term, this will involve identifying key facts/vocabulary and using their note-taking skills.
	Writing – our writing will include creating fiction and non-fiction texts. Pupils will develop skills in: character development, creating settings, structuring imaginative stories, how to layout/present various genres of texts, audience
	awareness, using figurative language & vocabulary. Listening & talking – Throughout this term I aim to develop pupil confidence in speaking/presenting to an audience. They will be learning the skills of presenting which include: use of voice, pace, tone, eye-contact and body language.

Mathematics and Numeracy	Maths - P.7 will learn all about 3D shape. They will learn the names of each shape and identify the properties of each, (faces, vertices & edges). They will also be required to identify 3D shapes in the real world, e.g Rubik's Cube= square prism/cube
2 the pication	Pupils will develop information handling skills by collecting, organising, displaying and interpreting data/information in various forms, e.g bar graph, tally chart, pie chart and trend graph. Pupils will learn how to use technology to present their graphs.
	We will also be learning about angles in the world and the 8 compass points . Pupils will learn how to use a protractor to measure and draw angles. They will also learn to identify and draw lines of symmetry .
	Numeracy - in numeracy we will learn about fractions . The skills which the pupils will develop are: comparing and ordering fractions in order of size, simplifying fractions, adding and subtracting fractions.
	We will continue to work on the 4 main operations , adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. Please encourage your child to continue to learn the times tables facts at home as these will help their progress.
Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)	Our class novel, Divided City , will be the focus of a mini theme. Pupils will learn about Glasgow landmarks, racism and diversity within Glasgow. Coaches from Rangers Football Club will work for a full day with P.7 working in football skills, diversity within Glasgow diversity of the testing of Coaches.
	diversity, meta skills and they will approach the topic of LGBQT. The Wizard of Oz performance will allow opportunities to develop skills in many curricular areas such as: drama, literacy, music and art.
Social Studies	We are hoping that our enterprise business, The Badger's Pantry will begin this term. We are working alongside Wilma,
	from Asda to set up a food store where parents/ carers can select food items. This will require pupils to take on various roles from business manager, advertising team members, pantry assistants etc. This is an initiative that pupils are organising to help support our local community. We will learn about Scottish Witches (Pollok witches), as part of our whele scheel Scottish theme. We will also be learning a Scattish care and uncareful in the life and work as for the provide a function.
Sciences	whole school Scottish theme. We will also be learning a Scottish song and researching the life and works of Robert Burns. P.6 & P.7 will work together on S.T.E.M activities. Pupils will work within groups to solve problems using technological and problem solving skills.
Technologies	We will focus on learning about forces , where pupils will explore friction, electrostatic, gravitational and magnetic forces. Pupils will learn how to create a short video using iMovie . They will develop their editing skills and learn new skills on
	how to record a short movie/ video showing awareness of light, image and sound. Pupils will also learn how to use the app Excel as part of their maths lessons.
Religious and Moral Education	We will use our previous learning in the Reformation as part of Divided City mini topic. Pupils will develop their knowledge on the Christian celebration Easter .
Health and Wellbeing	Pupils will learn about the circulatory system, with the main focus being on the human heart . They will learn how to locate and measure their heart rate before, during and after exercise.
RESPECT	Our P.E focus will be badminton . We will also have a few sessions of volleyball (at pupils' request) as well as coaching in football from Rangers' coaches.
