

# Ibrox Primary School 2022/2023



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## Supporting Improvement: Standards and Quality Report



The summary report is provided for parents/carers and partners to outline our achievements this session and our priorities for next session. Throughout this session we have taken forward our priorities as detailed in our school improvement plan. Through our processes of self-evaluation, we have identified how we can improve outcomes for our children and young people.

### **Our achievements and improvements this year.**

#### **We would like to highlight the following improvements/achievements:**

At Ibrox Primary we feel pupil voice is a strength. All children were involved in one of our 14 committees in session 22/23. Every committee felt they made a positive difference to our school and local community. Ms Finlayson and our HSSO worked closely to improve our procedures to monitor attendance and targeted support was given to identified families. Early indications show this is having an on-going positive impact on our attendance figures.

This session we started our Rights Respecting Schools journey. We created a Steering Group who audited our practice and created an Action Plan. We were delighted to achieve our Bronze Award in May and we are now working towards achieving Silver status.

Our effective partnership working continues to be a strength at Ibrox. This session we developed new links with Govan and Linthouse Parish Church, Life Academy school in Kenya, Women on Wheels, University of Glasgow Engineering Department and the local charity, Right There. Ms Whitehead and our Active Schools coordinator, James Hemmingsley, have been working hard to promote cycling within the school community. A monthly Bike Bus took place and funding was secured to host an after-school family cycling club in collaboration with the charity Women on Wheels. This was a big success.

#### **Developments in learning and teaching and assessment**

Improvements in Teaching and Learning was a key priority of our improvement work in session 22/23. Staff worked collaboratively on the CEP modules and through collaboration and enhanced focus on their pedagogy have a deeper understanding of effective use of Learning Intentions and Success Criteria, Feedback and Differentiation to support all learners.

Further engagement with the four capacities and the four contexts for learning through staff development with Jane Arthur (Quality Improvement Officer) has ensured we continue to provide relevant learning experiences for our children. This has ensured almost all children are very involved and highly engaged in their learning.

Digital Literacy continued to be a focus with all classes using iPads to enhance learning experiences. All Second Level class have 1-1 devices with children using their iPads in class to foster creativity, allow personalisation and choice in learning and provide accessibility to all. Mrs Chalmers completed the Apple Learning Coach accreditation and used this to support staff with the new 1-1 iPads.

### **Progress in promoting well-being, equality and inclusion**

The wellbeing of our children and their families is at the heart of all we do at Ibrox. We work closely with a number of local partners, including Govan Help and NSPCC, who help to support in a variety of ways.

At Ibrox we value and celebrate diversity. Our Diversity committee created a wonderful wall display to share the 31 languages spoken at Ibrox and they arranged for the flag of each nationality in the school to be hung in our hall. Visitors to the school always comment on this.

Our Values committee consulted with children, families and partners about their understanding of our school values and what they look like in action. They created a wall display at the front door to share their findings.

We hosted the successful launch of the updated NHS Health and Wellbeing resource, Your Body Matters in May. Two of our teachers were involved in the review and improvement of the resource. This work was done alongside colleagues from other sectors.

The creation and development of our Pre-Loved shop by one of our pupil groups has been a great success in supporting our children and families. This will continue to evolve next session.

### **Progress in children's learning/raising attainment and recognising achievement**

At Ibrox we continually ensure there is a clear focus on raising attainment. Overall attainment is good. There have been encouraging improvements in session 22/23, particularly within First Level.

P6 and P7 children visited Blairvadach Outdoor Centre for a weekend trip early in the session. This residential experience allowed the children the chance to experience a wide variety of activities and develop a range of skills. In May Primary 6 and 7 collaboratively planned and staged a performance of The Wizard of Oz allowing the children to develop a range of skills in many curricular areas as well as developing confidence through performing to an audience. This show was thoroughly enjoyed by the pupils throughout the school and their families and friends. It was a great success!

Our annual celebration at the end of term took place, for the first time, at Linthouse and Govan Parish Church. This not only created a new partnership but also provided the perfect setting for this occasion. Staff, children and parents all commented positively on the venue. It gave the event a "special" feel and it allowed everyone to clearly and easily see and hear all involved.

### **Here is what we plan to improve next year.**

In session 2023/2024 we plan to:

1. Review and improve approaches to assessment and moderation
2. Raise attainment in Literacy by - introducing the phonic and reading resource Read Write Inc, reviewing the teaching and learning of spelling and focusing on effective differentiation in reading lessons.
3. Develop Learning for Sustainability with a focus on Eco and our Rights Respecting Schools journey, towards Silver accreditation.
4. Improve HWB through our Values, an improved understanding of the Nurture Principles, our playground developments and loose parts play.
