


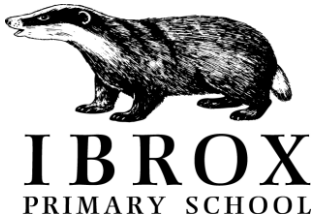


Curricular Area	Details
<p>Language and Literacy including French in P5-P7</p> 	<p>Listening and Talking- We will continue to develop our listening and talking skills this term. We will be taking part in class presentations, Show and Tell, Everywhere Bears Adventure, and sharing our learning. We will focus on answering questions as well as asking questions to gain further knowledge.</p> <p>Reading- We are excited to be starting our new phonics program, Read Write Inc. We will be starting to read, say, and write initial single sounds. The children can practice their sounds at home through Showbie. Once Showbie is set up we will notify Parents/Carers.</p> <p>We will continue to read with our P7 buddies on a weekly basis. So far this has been a very positive experience. We will also continue with our weekly star stories. Through this, the children will develop a wide range of vocabulary and answer comprehension questions around each star story.</p> <p>Writing- This term we will focus on Recount writing. After our weekly trips to the park, we will discuss our day and then write a recount. Children will be encouraged to draw a detailed picture and to discuss all the details. Through our minibeast topic, children will have plenty of opportunities to become scientists and researchers and will be observing, discussing, and taking notes.</p> <p>We will continue with the foundations of writing on a weekly basis.</p>
<p>Mathematics and Numeracy</p> 	<p>This term we will consolidate our numeracy understanding around 2D and 3D shapes. We have already started addition and subtraction in class. We will also explore measurement and capacity in class and through outdoor learning. We will compare and describe lengths, heights, mass, and capacities. We will learn the appropriate vocabulary such as longer, shorter, taller, heavier, lighter, more and less. We will use a range of non-standard units to estimate and measure various objects.</p>
<p>Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)</p>	<p>This term our minibeast topic will allow us to explore science, maths, and expressive arts.</p>
<p>Social Studies</p>	<p>Through our topic, we will explore the natural environment in which different mini-beasts live.</p>
<p>Sciences</p>	<p>Through learning about mini beasts, we will learn about living and non-living things. We will observe and describe the habitats of various mini beasts and compare the features of habitats and mini beasts. We will look at the different diets of the mini beasts.</p>
<p>Technologies</p> 	<p>We will use our school iPads to research information about minibeads, habitats, food, and plants.</p>
<p>Religious and Moral Education</p>	<p>This term we will be learning about various festivals and events such as Halloween, Guy Fawkes day, and Christmas. We will be preparing for our nativity which will be held on 13TH Dec.</p>
<p>Health and Wellbeing</p>	<p>We will continue exploring children's rights. This term our focus is on Article 16, 31 and 24. Through our daily mile and weekly sessions at the park, we will focus on building stamina and resilience. This term we will also be engaging in Yoga sessions to help with focus, concentration, and relaxation.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts</p>	<p>Drama- Lots of role-play opportunities to help build confidence and language development. As part of our minibeast topic we will have a laboratory set up in the classroom and children will have plenty opportunities to become scientists, researchers and explorers.</p> <p>Art- We will continue with lots of paint work and junk modelling around mini beasts.</p> <p>Music- The children will take part in CREATE music lessons fortnightly with Mrs Thomas , focussing on musical patterns, listening to rhythm and rhyme.</p>
<p>How you can help/Other Information</p>	<p>Remember to dress your child weather-appropriate for park days and please give a small snack which will be easy to carry for your child. Preferably no tubs in case the tub gets left behind in the park. Parents/carers are welcome to join us for the walk down to the park as helpers.</p>

Attendance

At Ibrox Primary we work hard to ensure that our children receive the best education that we can give them through a varied and interesting curriculum. Attendance at school is the best way to ensure that a child is learning. We recognise that absence can be due to a variety of reasons, and we ask that you contact the school to let us know the reason if your child is unable to attend. We regularly monitor the attendance of children, and send home letters if their attendance falls below 90%. Where we continue to be worried, we invite parents to meet with us to discuss how we can work together to improve this.

Our target is to have an average school attendance figure of above 90%.

Last year our actual figure was 88.5%. We look forward to working with our families to try to achieve our target this session.

Term 1's average attendance = 94.44% Well done everyone! That's above our target for the year. Here's hoping we can keep this up all year.
