| <p data-bbox="86 120 363 188">Language and Literacy</p>  | <p data-bbox="379 120 1501 181"><u>Spelling</u>: The children will continue to learn new sounds, words and spelling rules on a weekly basis through our new RWI literacy programme.</p> <p data-bbox="379 185 1501 304"><u>Reading</u>: We are going to begin our new class novel this term. This will be the children's choice so it remains to be seen which one will be picked! This helps us develop a range of skills including inference, prediction and visualisation. We will also explore non-fiction books.</p> <p data-bbox="379 309 1501 369"><u>Writing</u>: This term we will be creating our own poetry based on our topics as well as learning to write non-chronological reports.</p> <p data-bbox="379 374 1501 427"><u>Listening & Talking</u>: Pupils will develop their confidence in talking and listening by preparing a short 'book talk' to share with the class, using a script practiced in class.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 434 363 501">Mathematics and Numeracy</p>  | <p data-bbox="379 434 1501 629">P3 will be developing their skills in multiplying this term, focusing primarily on the 2 and 4 times tables. We will also use this knowledge as we learn to divide. The children will learn to round numbers to the nearest 10 and 100, then use this learning to support them in estimating the answers to addition and subtraction problems. We will learn about 2D and 3D shapes, and of course, continue working on our fundamental numeracy skills such as skip counting and place value.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 636 363 703">Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)</p> | <p data-bbox="379 636 1501 703">Our class topic this term is Harvest. This will enable us to explore areas across the curriculum including Health and Wellbeing, Social Studies and Technologies.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 721 363 786">Social Studies</p> | <p data-bbox="379 721 1501 786">The children will be considering the journey and impact our food has on the environment as opposed to that of other countries, as well as the jobs involved in producing it.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 792 363 853">Sciences</p> | <p data-bbox="379 792 1501 853">We are finishing off our 'Space' IDL with a visit to the Science Centre. Miss Semp will then lead our science for the term, focusing on bacteria, germs and illnesses.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 860 363 927">Technologies</p>  | <p data-bbox="379 860 1501 949">This term we will be extending our knowledge of how to use digital technology in a safe, responsible way. We will learn about ownership of materials online, consent and safe searching using appropriate search engines.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 956 363 1023">Religious and Moral Education</p> | <p data-bbox="379 956 1501 1039">This term, we are learning about Muslim and Sikh beliefs. We will consider the main values and traditions of each religion, comparing them to Christianity and our own beliefs. We will also learn about Diwali and Christmas.</p> |
| <p data-bbox="86 1046 363 1113">Health and Wellbeing</p>  | <p data-bbox="379 1046 1501 1167"><u>PE</u>: We are going to be learning gymnastics this term, culminating in the children creating a routine featuring travelling, rolling and balancing. This develops their skills in core strength, balance, coordination and also demonstrating a positive growth mindset when faced with challenges.</p> <p data-bbox="379 1171 1501 1263"><u>HWB</u>: P3 will be continuing to discuss the themes of friendship, kindness, caring and showing compassion through regular discussions and Circle Times. These align with our school values and encourage the children to think about Children's Rights.</p> |

At Ibrox Primary we work hard to ensure that our children receive the best education that we can give them through a varied and interesting curriculum. Attendance at school is the best way to ensure that a child is learning. We recognise that absence can be due to a variety of reasons, and we ask that you contact the school to let us know the reason if your child is unable to attend. We regularly monitor the attendance of children, and send home letters if their attendance falls below 90%. Where we continue to be worried, we invite parents to meet with us to discuss how we can work together to improve this. **Our target is to have an average school attendance figure of above 90%**. Last year our actual figure was 88.5%. We look forward to working with our families to try to achieve our target this session.

Term 1's average attendance = 94.44% Well done everyone! That's above our target for the year. Here's hoping we can keep this up all year.
