Literacy


Children in Primary 6 will be reading the novel, 'Coraline' (2002) by Neil Gaiman.

For reading, your child will be provided an 'Oxford Reading Tree' or 'Tree Tops' book to support reading fluency, expression and understanding at home. In class, we will discuss the features of fiction and nonfiction texts, make predictions before and after reading and learn to summarise with precision. P6 will be encouraged to read a novel of their choice throughout the Term and participate in 'Everyone Reading in Class Time' daily. This is to foster a love of reading in class.

For writing this term, your child will be learning about character and explanation texts. Primary 6 will aim to improve their grammar, spelling, structure and detail in writing this Term.

In addition to this, handwriting will be a focus.

Numeracy and Maths



In Maths, your child will be learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. They will also read and interpret data from a range of tables, graphs and charts.

Please encourage your child to practise (times tables/mental strategies for number) at home – this can be done through their Magma Maths login and on the 'Top Marks' website.

Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)



This term our IDL focuses are 'Artificial Intelligence' (AI) and 'Supernatural Beings'. We will be developing the following skills:

- ⇒ Research
- ⇒ 'Comparing' and 'Contrasting'
- ⇒ Defining new vocabulary
- ⇒ Explaining new learning in own words

Your child will continue developing their mental, social and emotional wellbeing using the Emotion Works programme, focusing on:
