Literacy


The children in P7A will be reading the novel 'Wonder' by R.J. Palacio, which ties in beautifully with the work we are doing in class on school values and children's rights.

For reading, your child will get a core reader to practice at home in preparation for discussions in class.

For writing this term, your child will be focussing on up-levelling recount texts using adventurous vocabulary, an increasing range of punctuation and conjunctions and a variety of sentence openers to make their writing grammatically correct and even more interesting.

Children will be encouraged to read for pleasure and may bring books home from the class/school library. Please encourage your child to read at home with you or independently to develop their reading skills. You can talk to your child about their book.

In Maths, your child will be extending their knowledge of 2D and 3D shapes. At home, please encourage your child to practise their times tables and mental strategies using their Magma Maths login.

Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)

This term our IDL focus is Africa. We will be developing our knowledge and understanding of how this continent is known as the 'cradle of mankind.' We will be comparing our local area with one in Africa, investigating the key features of weather and climate, discussing the impact on living things, and looking at the lifestyle and culture of African citizens.
