Literacy

Reading- In P.7T, pupils will read the novel Wonder by R.J. Palacio. This novel will allow us to explore and learn about visible and invisible disabilities. It will also address the themes of inclusion, friendship, kindness, and tolerance.

On occasion your child will be asked to read chapters of the novel for homework, it would be wonderful if you could read along with or listen to your child read. This will help develop skills and confidence in their readina.

Children will also be encouraged to read for pleasure at home and may bring books home from the class/school library.

Throughout the term pupils will have opportunities to read a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts.

Numeracy and Maths

This term, your child will be reinforcing their knowledge and understanding of number focusing on place value, times tables and addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Please encourage your child to practise the times tables and mental strategies for number) at home – this can be done through their Magma Maths login on their iPad.
