

# Ibrox Primary School's Standards & Quality Report Session 2024 – 2025



This summary report is provided for parents/carers and partners to outline our achievements and improvements during session 2024 - 2025 and to share our improvement priorities for 2025 - 2026. Throughout last session we took forward our improvement priorities as detailed in our school improvement plan. Using our approaches to self-evaluation, we have detailed in this report the impact of our work and identified how we plan to continue to improve outcomes for our children and young people.

#### The context of the school

In session 24-25 our school roll was around 220. 45% of our families live in SIMD 1+2 with 35% of our children being awarded free school meals (FSM). Last session our average attendance was 92.4%. We value our diverse community with 32 languages being spoken across our school where 68% of our children have English as an Additional Language. Within our school 68.8% of our children have one or more identified additional support needs. 6% of our children are care experienced.

## QI 1.3 - Key developments in Leadership of Change

All children benefited from participating in a wide range of leadership roles. Through these roles the children had the opportunity to lead change and make a positive difference to the school and wider community. In session 24/25 the school made significant improvements in our Anti-Racism journey. The head teacher has supported staff as well as members of our JLT and RRS Steering Group to confidently lead this work.

### QI 2.1 - Developments in Learning, Teaching and Assessment

In 24/25 an aspect of our SIP was to have an enhanced focus on the pedagogical area of differentiation. All staff have increased confidence levels following professional learning sessions. All staff reported having increased confidence when differentiating numeracy & maths and reading. The teaching staff started using the White Rose Maths resource which they feel has had a positive impact on the teaching and learning of numeracy and maths.

#### QI 3.1 - Progress in promoting Wellbeing, Equality and Inclusion

We improved the number of opportunities offered to children to allow them to discuss and explore their mental health. We introduced Play Therapy, 1-1 counselling with LifeLink, Seasons for Growth and Nurture Natter as well as continuing to provide nurture support for those who need it.

All children in the school were involved in one of our 15 committees in session 24/25. Committees all set targets for the year linked to Articles from the Convention on the Rights of the Child and The Global Goals for Sustainable Development. Every committee felt they made a positive difference to our school and local community. # QI 3.2 - Progress in Children's Learning - Raising Attainment and Recognising Achievement

Overall, children's attainment in literacy and numeracy is good. The school is making effective progress towards improving children's attainment and achievement across the curriculum. In classes throughout the school the majority of children are on track to achieve Curriculum for Excellence levels in literacy and numeracy. Children with additional support needs are benefiting from a range of support which is helping almost all to make progress at their own level.
