Dear Parents/Carers

Happy New Year to all our families, Parents and Carers. Hope you all had a wonderful and restful winter break! The children have settled in quickly and are ready to start Term 3. In addition to several whole school newsletters each term, you will receive a newsletter each term written by your child's teacher/s which will keep you informed about the curriculum and plans for the term ahead. Literacy



Children in P1-P5 are working on the Read, Write Inc scheme. Children are undergoing their second assessment of the year and will be grouped in the first few weeks of term. This allows children to be taught the specific special friends they need to progress with their reading.

Our class novel this term is Bill's New Frock. The reading skills we are focussing on as a class are questioning, comprehension and prediction. We will draw on knowledge of vocabulary to understand texts.

We are continuing our daily writing with CYPIC, this is allowing the children to become confident applying the tools for writing. As a class we will be learning about the genres such as Scots Poetry and developing our skills, knowledge and ability to create these.

Children will be encouraged to read for pleasure and may bring books home from the class/school library. Please encourage your child to read at home with you or independently to develop their reading

Numeracy and Maths



This term, your child will continue to build their number knowledge by practising inverse operations using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division up to 1,000. Children will continue to use strategies such bridging, partitioning, number lines, patterns and fact families to help them solve number problems and equations. In Maths, your child will focus on Fractions, to be able to add and compare fractions. Also, we will total amounts of money, practise giving change, read analogue and digital clocks, and develop data analysis skills by working with tables, charts and graphs. Please continue to practice times tables with your child.

Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)



This term we will be exploring Our Local Environment and the surrounding area. We hope to be able to create models of the recently built new bridges in the area. We will also be researching the history of Bellahouston Park and its cultural and architecture links focussing on the House of an Art Lover.

Health and Wellbeing



Our PE days are Wednesday and Thursday. Please make sure your child has suitable shoes and comfortable P.E. kit. We will be focusing on team building exercise using PE Counts. We will learn to play Basketball to help improve our ball skills and encourage teamwork.

Your child will continue developing their mental, social and emotional wellbeing focusing on Emotions. We will use our class novel to explore emotions, stereotypes, identity and empathy



Lost Property: We have a huge amount of lost property, please speak to your child about taking care of their belongings, especially jumpers and jackets. **Please ensure all clothing is labelled with their name.** Reminder, children should bring a warm, waterproof jacket each day as they go out to play in all weathers.

Homework: At Ibrox Primary school, we encourage using homework as a chance for children to develop key skills such as independence in learning and time management/ organisation.

In Primary 4 children will be given words and reading books to practise. Spelling and number practise will be available. Please use the homework grid provided to complete spelling activities.

Homework will be handed out on a Monday and should be returned by Friday.

Please practice times tables at home. In class we are currently up to the 8 times table.
