Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! This term is going to be a busy one with lots of exciting things happening.

Literacy



The children in P7 will continue to read the novel 'Wonder' by R J Palacio.

For reading, your child will continue to bring home a core reader to practice each night in preparation for discussions in class.

For writing this term, your child will be focussing on creating reports and persuasive texts, ensuring key features such as clear structure, strong arguments, and subject-specific vocabulary is used. As well as the writing tasks above, every class in the school will be taking part in short, sharp bursts of writing four days per week. This is to improve the basic tools required for writing, such as grammar, punctuation, sentence starters, and conjunctions as well as developing speed and confidence.

Please encourage your child to read at home with you or independently to develop their reading skills. You can talk to your child about their book.

Numeracy and Maths



This term, your child will be reinforcing their knowledge and understanding of number focusing on addition and subtraction up to six-digit numbers and applying these skills to word problems.

In Maths, your child will be learning how to calculate the length of time a journey will take and the duration of activities and events. They will also be calculating the area and perimeter of shapes.

Please encourage your child to practise their times tables at home – this can be done through their Magma Maths login.

Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)



This term our IDL focus is what is air pollution and how does fast fashion affect this? We will be developing our knowledge and understanding of the impact fast fashion is having on our planet and what we can do to help reduce the effects.

Health and Wellbeing



Our PE days are: Wednesdays and Fridays. Please make sure your child has suitable shoes and comfortable P.E. kit. On Wednesdays we will be focusing on dance and on Fridays we will be developing skills used in a variety of sports with Mr Penman.

Your child will continue developing their mental, social and emotional wellbeing focusing on emotions and how we can manage these.



Lost Property: We have a huge amount of lost property, please speak to your child about taking care of their belongings, especially jumpers and jackets. **Please ensure all clothing is labelled with their name.** Reminder, children should bring a warm, waterproof jacket each day as they go out to play in all weathers.

Homework: At Ibrox Primary school, we encourage using homework as a chance for children to develop key skills such as independence in learning and time management/ organisation.

In Primary 7, homework will continue to be given out Monday through to Thursday. The children will receive a variety of homework tasks to reinforce concepts taught in class. These tasks should take no longer than 20-30 minutes to complete. The children should be encouraged to complete the work independently and to the same standard as expected in class.
