Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! This term we will be working with Catherine from Celtic Connections; pupils will learn how to sing in Scots' Gaelic. Pupils have the opportunity to continue with weekly violin lessons, Mr Penman will work with us on P.E on. Friday. We will also visit Ailsa Craig Care Home residents. Literacy

Children will be given opportunities to read a variety of texts, fiction & non-fiction. They will develop skills in reading for information, questioning and making inferences.

Pupils will learn how to identify the purpose of a text by skimming and scanning.

Pupils will once again be encouraged to borrow books from our class and school library, these books can be taken home and returned when read. Please encourage your child to read daily, at home.

In class pupils will use the comprehension reading box, this will be used to develop reading skills, confidence and to encourage independent reading.

Pupils will write a variety of non-fiction text linked to our topic, 'The Rainforest' and 'Air Pollution.'

Pupils will be encouraged to participate in class & group discussions and to create a presentation for the class.

Numeracy and Maths

This term, your child will be reinforcing their knowledge and understanding of number focusing on the 4 operations. These will be extended to include long division and long multiplication. We will learn about negative, prime and cubed numbers.

In Maths, your child will be learning how to calculate area, perimeter and cubic volume. Please encourage your child to practise times tables at home – this can be done through their Magma Maths login.



Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)

This term our IDL focus is the Rainforest and air pollution. We will be developing research, investigation, writing, reading, listening & talking, maths and art skills.



Health and Wellbeing

Our PE days are: Wednesday and Friday. Please make sure your child has suitable shoes and comfortable P.E. kit. We will be focusing on Scottish country dance as well as developing balance, problem solving, teamwork and communication skills.

Your child will continue developing their mental, social and emotional wellbeing focusing on firework safety, online safety and also through discussing emotions.



Lost Property: We have a huge amount of lost property, please speak to your child about taking care of their belongings, especially jumpers and jackets. **Please ensure all clothing is labelled with their name.** Reminder, children should bring a warm, waterproof jacket each day as they go out to play in all weathers.

Homework: At Ibrox Primary school, we encourage using homework as a chance for children to develop key skills such as independence in learning and time management/ organisation.

In Primary 7T all homework will be posted on Showbie. Pupils can access this from home. All tasks should be completed and returned to class when requested.

Weekly spelling is also given out as homework, pupils are expected to learn their words for a spelling test on a Friday.
