Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Term 2! The class are now settled into their P6 routine and are working hard!

Literacy



Our class novel in Term 2 was selected by the class. Primary 6 voted for 'How to Train your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell. We will explore themes of courage, leadership, acceptance and friendship.

For reading, your child will continue to improve their reading out loud (fluency and expression) and focus on note taking as a skill. They will also identify fact from opinion and discuss why an author has used various punctuation, imagery and vocabulary in a novel.

For writing this term, your child will be learning about persuasive and procedural texts. Towards the end of the Term, P6 will explore poetry and will have the opportunity to be creative!

Children will be encouraged to read for pleasure and keep a personal novel in their school tray which they are reading during ERIC (Everyone Reading in Class) time.

Health and Wellbeing



Our PE day is a Friday. We have a Football Coach from Pollok Club at 10:45 am and in the afternoon P6 work with PE specialist, Mr Penman. Please make sure your child has suitable shoes and comfortable kit. We will be focusing on resilience, problem solving, movement and team work.

Your child will continue developing their mental, social and emotional wellbeing focusing on 'Gender Stereotypes'. P6 will use their critical thinking skills to share their ideas and opinions on current gender issues in the world of work and sports.



Lost Property: We have a huge amount of lost property, please speak to your child about taking care of their belongings, especially jumpers and jackets. **Please ensure all clothing is labelled with their name.** Reminder, children should bring a warm, waterproof jacket each day as they go out to play in all weathers.

Numeracy and Maths



This term, your child will be reinforcing their knowledge and understanding of number focusing on:

- Estimation and rounding
- Adding and subtracting decimal numbers
- Identifying missing numbers in a calculation
- Solving negative number problems
- Compare and order fractions

In Maths, your child will be learning how to:

- Tell the time and calculate intervals
- Convert units of measure
- Calculate the perimeter and area of a 2D shape
- Create symmetrical shapes

Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)



This term our IDL focus is 'Air Pollution' and 'Democracy'. We will develop the skill to find, note and highlight key information from non-fiction texts and sources. We will also develop our creativity skills to design a political party manifesto, logo and proposed law.

Homework:

At Ibrox Primary school, we encourage using homework as a chance for children to develop key skills such as independence in learning and time management/organisation.

In Primary 6, the class are issued reading, spelling and numeracy homework every week. It continues to be distributed on a Monday and should be returned on a Friday, fully completed.
