## Class News Letter P3/2

Dear Parents/Carers,

We have had a wonderful few weeks settling into Primary 3/2 and we have a busy term ahead to look forward to! In addition to the whole school newsletter, you will receive a newsletter each term from your child's teacher which will keep you informed about the curriculum, what's going on in and out of class! If at any time you can help with resources or trips, please do not hesitate to contact us via the school office.

Here is to a great year in Primary 3/2! We have so much learning to do and so much to look forward to.

### Numeracy and Maths

This term, your child will be reinforcing their knowledge and understanding of number, focusing on counting, ordering and making numbers beyond 100. The class will be challenged with numbers to 1,000 where and when appropriate. We will solve simple addition and subtraction sums and learn the 2 and 10 times-tables.

In Maths, P3/2 will read information on a graph and learn the properties of 2D shape, including right angles.

Please encourage your child to practise their numbers at home – this can be done through their Magma Maths login, shared with you via Showbie.

### Health and Wellbeing

Our PE days are a Wednesday and a Friday. Please make sure your child has suitable shoes and a comfortable P.E. kit. Pupils cannot participate in PE without the correct shoes. Pupils must remove all jewellery.

We will be focusing on positive relationships, diversity and inclusion for our core HWB learning in class. Your child will continue developing their mental, social, and emotional wellbeing using the Emotion Works framework and 'Colour Monster' storybook characters.

### Uniform and Jackets

At Ibrox Primary, we promote wearing uniforms to foster school community and enhance security. The uniform consists of a white/pale/navy blue shirt/polo (with or without the logo), a navy or grey sweatshirt, and navy or grey trousers/skirt.

Children should bring a jacket for outdoor play in all weather, and all clothing should be labeled with their name.

### Literacy

Children in P1-5 will be working on the Read, Write Inc scheme. Assessments take place every 8 weeks with children set into ability groups for their lessons.

In class we will be reading a range of storybooks from authors Rachel Bright, Oliver Jeffers and Rob Biddulph. We will use these to develop our reading skills; predicting before, during and after reading, breaking blending and reading unfamiliar words and learn a range of common words.

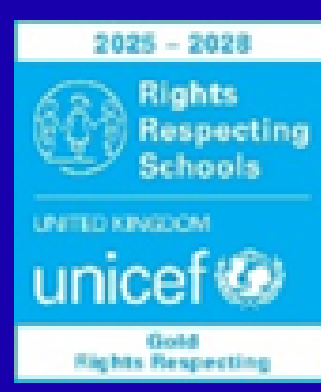
Children will be encouraged to read for pleasure and may bring books home from the class/school library. Please encourage your child to read at home with you or independently to develop their reading skills. Please encourage them to follow the words with their finger and discuss the characters and settings.

Writing: This term we will be focusing on 'recount' and 'character' writing. In addition to this genre focus, we will also be writing 3 days a week with a focus on Tools for Writing.

Talking and Listening: Children are given the opportunity to talk and listen in a variety of contexts. Vocabulary is explicitly taught using Word Aware strategies. Ask your children about their weekly words.

### Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)

This term our IDL focusses are 'Our Local Area' and, for pupil choice, 'Flags'. We will be developing our creative, sense-making and critical thinking skills. We will also develop our digital literacy skills through the use of iPads, completing simple digital art tasks.



### Homework

At Ibrox Primary school, we encourage using homework as a chance for children to develop key skills such as independence in learning and time management/ organisation. Later in the term, children will be given spelling words to practise, a reading book and a numeracy grid filled with various numeracy skills to practise at home. More information will be provided with homework handouts.

Once a term there will be a cross-curricular homework grid where children can complete their chosen activities. Homework will begin after the September weekend. It will be given out on a Monday and should be returned on the Friday.

### Rights Respecting School

As a **Gold Award Rights Respecting school** we have a whole school focus on a different article of the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) each month.

The focus articles for this term are 29, 19, 2, 3 and 12.
