Dear Parents/Carers,

We have had a wonderful few weeks settling into Primary 7 and we have a busy term ahead to look forward to! In addition to the whole school newsletter, you will receive a newsletter each term from your child's teacher which will keep you informed about the curriculum, what's going on in and out of class! If at any time you can help with resources or trips, please do not hesitate to contact us via the school office.

Numeracy and Maths

This term, your child will be reinforcing their knowledge and understanding of numbers to 1,000,000 through a range of practical and problems-solving tasks. They will be developing their confidence with the four operations, including addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

In Maths, the children will be developing their understanding of angles, including measuring, drawing and finding missing angles. They will also be developing their ability to interpret and discuss data.

Please encourage your child to practise their numbers at home – this can be done through their Magma Maths login, shared with you via Showbie.

Health and Wellbeing

Our PE days are Mondays and Fridays.

Please make sure your child has suitable shoes and a comfortable P.E. kit. Pupils cannot participate in PE without the correct shoes. Pupils must remove all jewellery.

We will be focusing on fundamental skills (running, skipping, co-ordination, balance, etc) and netball. Your child will continue developing their mental, social, and emotional wellbeing through Health and Wellbeing lessons.

Uniform and Jackets

At Ibrox Primary, we promote wearing uniforms to foster school community and enhance security. The uniform consists of a white/pale/navy blue shirt/polo (with or without the logo), a navy or grey sweatshirt, and navy or grey trousers/skirt.

Children should bring a jacket for outdoor play in all weather, and all clothing should be labeled with their name.

Literacy

In class, we will be reading *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio. We will use the novel to develop our reading skills; prediction, skimming, scanning, summarising, questioning and looking at themes within the text.

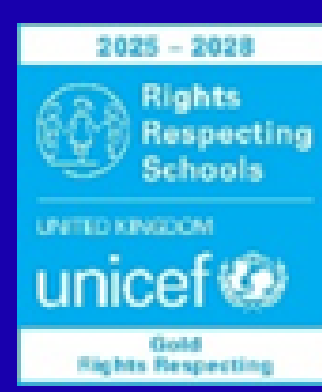
Children will be encouraged to read for pleasure and may bring books home from the class/school library. Please encourage your child to read at home with you or independently to develop their reading skills.

Writing: This term we will be focusing on poetry and persuasive writing as part of our UNCRC work and building our own businesses in our enterprise topic. In addition to these genres we will also be writing 3 days a week with a focus on Tools for Writing.

Talking and Listening: Children are given the opportunity to talk and listen in a variety of contexts. Vocabulary is explicitly taught using Word Aware strategies. Ask your children about their weekly words.

Inter-Disciplinary Learning (IDL/Topic)

This term our IDL focusses are the local community and Enterprise. We will be developing skills like organisation, resilience, initiative creativity, problem solving, teamwork and communication as we develop our own businesses to raise funds for Primary 7 events throughout the year.



Homework

At Ibrox Primary school, we encourage using homework as a chance for children to develop key skills such as independence in learning and time management/ organisation.

In Primary 7, homework will be given daily and should not take a great deal of time. The activities will consolidate learning that has taken place in class. Homework will include reading, spelling, research and number. Tasks will also be set on Magma Maths.

iPads should be brought to school every day to support learning. Please ensure they are fully charged and ready to be used.

Rights Respecting School

As a **Gold Award Rights Respecting school** we have a whole school focus on a different article of the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) each month.

The focus articles for this term are 29, 19, 2, 3 and 12.
