



#### National 5 Qualifications

National 5 courses are assessed through a question paper (exam) or coursework, or both - most of which will be marked by SQA.

In some subjects, coursework is completed throughout the year under exam conditions. Prelim exams will take place to gather evidence on progress in December 2025. The final exam diet for N5 subjects will take place throughout May 2026. Pupils will be supported and given every opportunity to achieve at National 5 level.

The courses are graded A to D or 'no award'. National 5 awards are essential if pupils have aspirations to achieve Higher qualifications in S5 / S6.

#### National 4, National 3 Qualifications

In National 3 and National 4 courses, learners complete unit assessments throughout the year. National 4 courses also include an end-of-year assessment called an added value unit.

These assessments are marked internally by class teachers. National 3 and National 4 courses are assessed as 'pass' or 'fail' and are quality assured by SQA.



# PROGRESSION TO HIGHER QUALIFICATIONS

To progress to Higher level courses in any subject, pupils must achieve a pass at National 5 level, graded A to C.

Higher courses consist of individual units and a final course assessment. These assessments may include exams (question papers), coursework (such as assignments or practical activities), or a combination of both. Most assessments are externally marked. Higher qualifications are graded from A to D, or may result in 'no award' if the required standard is not met.

Highers are the standard entry qualifications for higher education in Scotland, including college and university programmes.

In S5 and S6, pupils have the opportunity to specialise in subjects at Higher level that align with their career aspirations and meet the entry requirements for further education or employment.





#### Supported Study

Supported study sessions will be available throughout S4, organised by each department. These sessions will be structured to support pupils in the lead-up to prelims and final exams, and may also be offered regularly throughout the school year.

Details of supported study opportunities will be shared in advance. We strongly encourage all pupils to take full advantage of this valuable additional support to help them achieve their best.

#### Learner Conversations


Throughout S4, class teachers will engage in regular learning conversations with pupils to provide guidance and support.

Pupils will receive constructive feedback to help them understand their progress and identify specific areas for improvement.

In addition to this, Pupil Support teachers will have check-ins with pupils to ensure they stay on track and are well supported in achieving their goals.









## HOMENORK EXPECTATIONS

Homework tasks will be set by class teachers on a weekly basis. It is expected that all pupils should complete at least one homework task per week in each subject. Homework tasks will be set on Class Teams. Feedback should be offered to pupils by class teachers on homework tasks that have been submitted.

This infographic highlights the benefits and importance of homework. Homework is not just a task assigned by teachers to keep students occupied after school; it has far-reaching cognitive benefits and contributes to brain growth and development.

Through various homework assignments, students have the opportunity to enhance critical thinking skills, memory retention, and problem-solving abilities. Improved memory retention helps students perform better on exams and enhances their overall academic performance.

#### Prelim Exam Schedule

- Dates: 1st December 10th December 2025 (approx. 8 days)
- Note: Practical-based subjects may have exams outside this window.

#### Study Leave

- Pupils will have study leave during the prelim period.
- They should only attend school when they have an exam scheduled.

#### **Exam Timetable**

• A detailed schedule will be shared in advance to help pupils plan and prepare effectively.

#### **E** Study Support

- Study Packs: Provided by all departments to support home revision.
- Pupil Support Teachers: Will offer guidance on study skills and revision techniques throughout the year.

#### **Feedback & Analysis**

In January 2026, pupils will receive a 'S4 Prelim Analysis' document from all subjects.

#### This will include:

- Detailed feedback on performance
- Progress tracking
- Next steps for improvement





- The 2026 exams will start on Wednesday 22 April and finish on Monday 1 June. Results day will be Tuesday 4 August 2026.
- The 2026 SQA exam timetable will be published and shared with pupils, parents and carers in due course.
- Study leave will start for pupils after the Easter break exact date to be confirmed.
- Pupils will be offered the opportunity to engage in and be expected to attend additional supported study sessions in the lead up to final SQA exams.
- In addition to this, pupils will also be expected to attend 'Masterclass' sessions the day before each exam.
