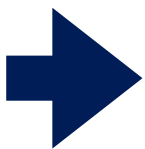

## Bonfire and Fireworks Safety

It is safer, better for the environment and often less expensive to attend organised public firework displays.

The general public can legally use fireworks between 6pm and 11pm (this extends to midnight on 5 November and 1am on Hogmanay, Chinese New Year and Diwali). Adults must not buy or supply fireworks to anyone under the age of 18 - with the exception of F1 fireworks (eg party poppers, novelty crackers and certain sparklers). Scottish Fire and Rescue advise that if we are unable to attend an organised display, we consider the impact of fireworks on people and animals. The noise and lights that fireworks emit can be overwhelming for people with a sensory impairment and those with neurological differences such as autism.
