

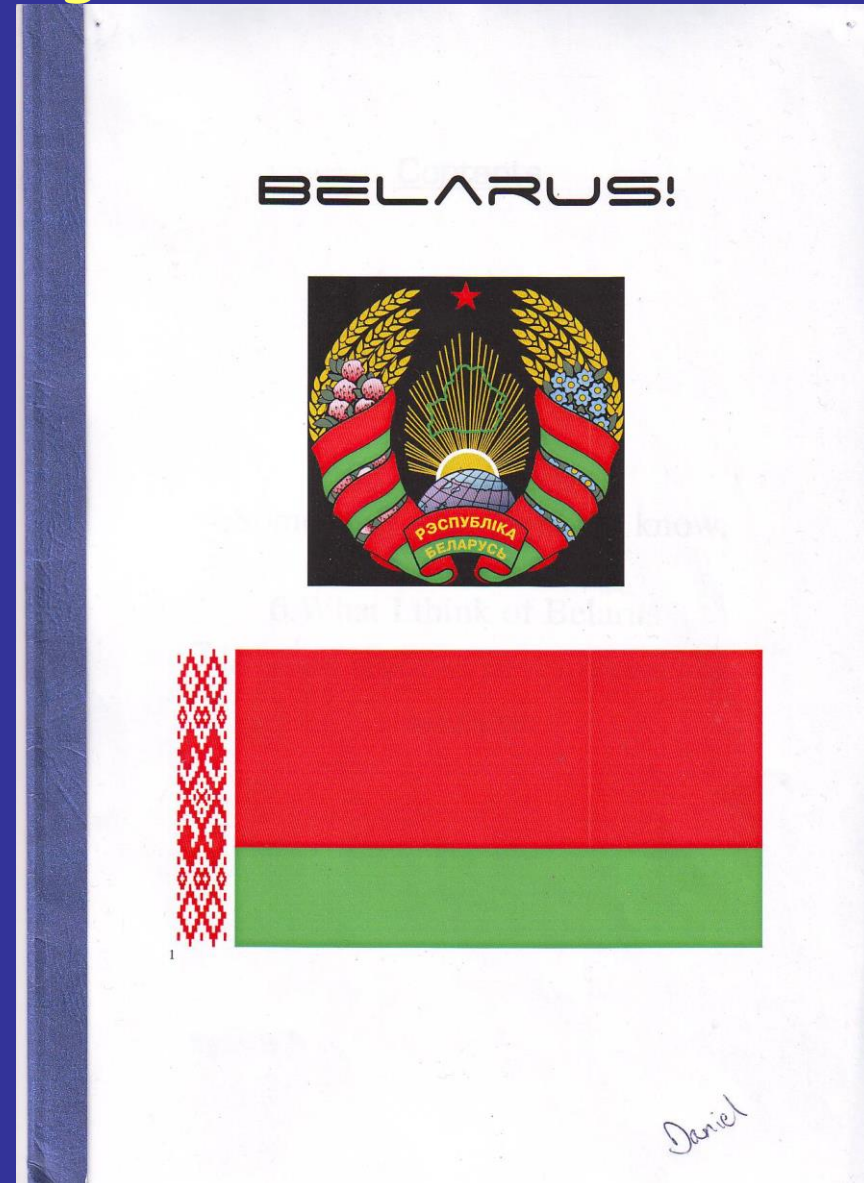

Landmarks

Sweden has many landmarks. One of the more famous landmarks is Ale's Stones. These are 59 large stones made of sandstone and weighing up to 1.8 tons each. It is a 67m long and 19m wide stone ship and human bones have been found inside the monument. It is thought to be an Iron-age burial ground.

Another landmark is Gripsholm Castle on the Lake Malaren. This was built in 1537 and commissioned by Swedish king Gustaf Vasa. It lies on the banks of Lake Malaren and can clearly be seen on the skyline around the small town of Marie Fredrikstad that is on the other side of the lake. It houses a wide selection of portraits from the time of Gustav Vasa to the modern day. One painting is of Benny Anderson of ABBA, who are something of a Swedish landmark in their own right.

An attraction much further north in the Lapland area is the Ice Hotel. This hotel is made of nothing but ice. It is built every winter and it melts every summer. It is made of the frozen waters of the Torne River. Everything in the hotel is made of ice: the ceiling, the floor, and the beds. It offers both warm accommodation and cold. The cold accommodation being in a room and a bed made of ice apart from a sleeping bag and mattress. There is even a church made entirely of ice.
