

Our key role is to provide personal support to pupils to ensure they achieve their potential by:


- Building good relationships with pupils

FAQs – PE Kit

- White t-shirt/polo shirt
- Black tracksuit bottoms, leggings or shorts

- No jewellery or piercings to be worn in PE







FAQs – Parking

- No access to school grounds unless by prior arrangement and in light of specific need
- Parking metres in operation
- We request that parents to find local drop off point in streets nearby the school (not the road leading up to school or on the yellow zig zags)







FAQs – PE Participation

- 'No opt out' policy
- Exercise has mental and physical benefits
- Pupils with specific health difficulties should still participate in other team roles such as coaches/referees/judges where appropriate







FAQs – Breakfast, interval, lunch, lockers

- S1 and S2 pupils remain in school grounds during break and interval
- Canteen open from around 8.20am serving toast, hot chocolate, etc
- Staff cannot accept cash details of parent payment method will be emailed out in due course
- Lockers are offered to everyone in the school rental letters will be issued to pupils in August







FAQs - Clubs + Trips

- Each year staff volunteer to run extra curricular clubs
- Full list will be in the pupil bulletin by September weekend
- Trips abroad have been a feature of our cultural education e.g.
 Modern Languages trips to Italy and Ski Trips







FAQs - Class setting

- Classes are not set in S1 other than in Maths
- Numeracy assessment in late August/early September
- Pupils are placed in classes that suit the pace of their learning progress is reviewed regularly
- Use of CAT tests/Literacy Assessments with all pupils







FAQs - School Transport

- No school transport to Notre Dame High
- When making a placing request, parents/carers lose any claim to funded school transport
- Parents/carers can apply for a travel card online www.glasgow.gov.uk







FAQs - School Meals and Uniform Grant

- Pupils eligible for free school meals in primary school will also qualify here, you do not need to submit a new application, but you must return declaration paperwork in June.
- Parents/carers can apply for Free Meal Entitlement and uniform subsidy grants (£110) – apply online from July 2021.
- Applications should be made via www.glasgow.gov.uk decisions are made at council level, not by the school










National Improvement Framework: Achieving Excellence and Equity
