As attendance continues to be part of our improvement priorities, I am pleased to notify parents and carers that our current rate is 93.5%! This is above the Glasgow Primary Average and above where we were the previous session. This is very positive news and I thank-you all for supporting attendance across the school.

Mrs Watt will continue to work with families providing support and advice, where required, in maximising attendance.

Our aim this session is to maintain 92%, with a grand challenge of all children attending school between 90% and 100%.

Junior Road Safety

Sickness and Reporting of Illness and Absence

Should I keep my child off school or childcare?

llness	Until
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the advice on NHS inform if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
