
Parent Council Corner

Health and Wellbeing (HWB); Sexual Health and Relationship Education (SHRE) lessons will be delivered throughout this term to all classes from Primary 1-7. On-going Health Promotion in Pirie Park Primary: we aim to be a Health Promoting School and want to thank parents/carers for all of their support, providing children with healthy snacks and drinks.

Please continue to encourage your children to bring in healthy snacks so we can make Term 3 and 4 even healthier than before. Classes continue with @_thedailymile to help support us in our aim to be #healthier #happier #smarter and children continue to benefit from the fresh air and being more active.

Children are not allowed to bring cans or glass bottles into school for Health and Safety reasons. Energy drinks are also not allowed as they are considered extremely harmful to children. We suggest that children bring water in a plastic bottle into school; they can refill this in school when required. Water is FREE, healthy & will safeguard children's teeth from the carbon dioxide (fizzy bubbles) which causes decalcification of tooth enamel & reduces children's high sugar and additives intake. We ask for YOUR support to keep YOUR children healthy.

Head Lice - we have had some reports of head lice. Can we ask that you ensure you check your own children's heads weekly as part of their routine; treating as and only if required? Please let us know if this problem persists and school health will be happy to advise.

Nut Allergies - these can be life threatening. We have a few children in school with such an allergy. Please refrain from sending any nuts or nut products into school in order to minimise any risk to children. Thank you for your support with this.

CELEBRATE, CELEBRATE, CELEBRATE!!!! CHRISTMAS


