Families can choose to come for the morning session **9:15-10:15am** or **1:30-2:30pm**. These sessions will be hosted in our gym hall and our new children are welcome to spend some time in our Primary 1 classrooms. We are excited to meet our new *wee Roch* stars!

Rights Respecting School

Our Rights Respecting group have been working hard to teach all our children about the United Nations Rights of the Child. This is teaching children about the importance of rights and responsibilities. This week we are promoting Mental Health Awareness, and our key message is '**Our Voice Matters**'. Young Leaders of Learning (YLL)

We have been partnered with Hillhead Primary School as part of the Young Leaders of Learning Programme. This programme enables young peoples' voices to be heard in education and enables them to identify steps for improvement in different areas of school life. This year, the focus for improvement will be on **Relationships.** Our YLL from Primary 6 and Primary 7 will work in partnership to; carry out research, host a visit from our partner school and contribute effective feedback when visiting Hillhead Primary. They will work on creating an action plan for improvement to take forward. This will support the work we are already doing to become a Rights Respecting School.

Restorative Approaches

Primary 6 have launched our 'Peace Pals'. Trained pupils in restorative practice will be supporting in the playground daily. These pupils have a series of questions that can help problem solve conflict between children in the yard. This practice allows pupils to have solution-oriented mindsets and to develop their problem-solving skills. Our 'Peace Pals' contribute to our journey towards a Rights Respecting School as it promotes Article 12 - 'You have the right to an opinion and for it to be listened to and taken seriously'.

Sports Clubs

We are lucky to have a full timetable of curriculum, lunch and after school clubs. This term we are working with PEPASS, Glasgow Life, St Roch's Secondary Sports Leaders, City Glasgow College and Partick Thistle coaches. Over the full year we offer opportunities to our mainstream and deaf department over all stages. This term our coaches are working with the Infant Deaf Class, P2s, P4s, P5s, P6s and P7s.

Every Friday afternoon the children will be taking part in skills-based activities with their peers in the same stage. These activities will be focused on creative play skills such as crafting, modelling, jigsaws, group board games, cycling, bracket making and reading for enjoyment. This programme is linked to United Nations Rights of the Child Article 31- the right to play.
