## **Staff Update**

We are looking forward to welcoming a number of student teachers to Scotstoun Primary in the coming weeks. This month Miss Dickson will be joining P3b until December. Ms Napier (P3a), Miss Richardson (P4b) and Ms Anderson (P3/2) will be in school one day a week until next April. Supporting Initial Teacher Education is an important part of school life as school placements are a key part of the training of the teachers of tomorrow. The student teachers receive an induction to life in Scotstoun and work closely with the class teacher and are mentored by the senior leadership team.

### Attendance

To help tackle lower school attendance, Scottish Government's Parent Club launched a new School Attendance campaign on 30th October. Resources to support families can be found here School & Education | Parent Club.

We continue to focus on attendance and timekeeping as a school. Our current school average is 95.7% which is higher than June 25 Thank you for your ongoing support with this. I would like to aim for 96% this session. Every single day a child is absent from school means a day of lost learning. 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance but the reality is 90% attendance means your child has missed 10% of their learning which is nearly 4 school weeks over a school year. ### **School Travel Plan**

Together with representatives from Glasgow Eco Trust and Glasgow City Council, parents and children, we have formed a working group to take forward our active travel agenda and work in consultation with local stakeholders. Our aim is to encourage a shift to sustainable and active travel reducing car congestion and unsafe behaviours in the streets around the school. The plan aims to increase pupil health and road safety skills, reduce traffic congestion and pollution around schools, and raise awareness among pupils, parents, and staff about the consequences of travel choices. I will keep you updated of the work we are doing in subsequent newsletters.

#### **P1 Enrolment**

Enrolment week begins w/c 3<sup>rd</sup> November. The families of children due to start school in August 2026 are invited to register their child online during registration week. We are holding an open afternoon and open evening for all new catchment Primary 1 pupils and parents to attend on either Monday 17th of November from 1.30-3.00 pm or Tuesday 18th of November from 5.00 -7.00 pm. Please come along with your child to one of these sessions for a guided tour of the school with our P6 pupils and a chance to meet the school staff. It is customary for children to attend their local school. As is usual practice, families can make placing requests but need to register at their local catchment school.

### **Health and Safety**

We would ask that you keep us up to date with any medical conditions your child may have. In addition, if your child has to take medicine for a short period of time, please come into the School Office to complete a form which allows us to administer that.

Families are reminded of the importance of checking your child's hair regularly for head lice. School nurses no longer do this and it is not authority policy to send out letters when a child is reported to have head lice. The advice remains the same, immediate treatment by lotion recommended by a pharmacist, then automatic repeat treatment 7 days later. Please be vigilant.

After school hours, parents and children should not enter the school unaccompanied. If you have left or lost an item in school, please visit the school office in the first instance who will be happy to help you there.

## **Community Links**

Next week community police officers are coming to P6 and P7 to speak to them about safe and appropriate online behaviour. This will be an ongoing focus in school.

Knightswood Fire Service visited the P4-P7 assembly to speak to them about fire safety around bonfire night.

P5 participated in the Active Schools North West fun run in Victoria Park and some girls from P6 and P7 participated in the Active Schools Northwest netball tournament.
