Child Sexual Exploitation



CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION IS A FORM OF CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE AND IS A PRIORITY FOR POLICE SCOTLAND

Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) is a form of Child Sexual Abuse in which a person(s) of any age takes advantage of a power imbalance to force or entice a child (under 18) into engaging in sexual activity in return for something received by the child and/or those perpetrating or facilitating the abuse. As with other forms of sexual abuse, the presence of perceived consent does not undermine the abusive nature of the act.

RISK INDICATORS

CSE should be considered if a young person meets <u>any</u> of the following indicators

Acquisition of money, clothes, drugs/alcohol, mobile phone etc. without plausible explanation

Persistently going missing

Distressed behaviour; becoming aggressive or violent, self harming, upset, withdrawn, refusal to engage etc.

Agitated/stressed prior to leaving home/care

Returning under the influence, distraught or dishevelled

Inappropriate sexualised behaviour for age

Evidence or suspicion of physical or sexual assault, including making then withdrawing a disclosure

Relationships with controlling individuals

Frequenting 'party flats' or locations known for prostitution

Young people may not recognise they are being exploited and they may tell you that they are making a choice. However, this perception is a result of **grooming**. Grooming is the process that perpetrators use to trick a child or young person into believing they are trustworthy, eventually leading to sexually exploiting their victim.
