


DOROTHY MUST DIE by Danielle Paige






LEGEND by Marie Lu (eAudio Book)




ALL ABOUT TOM

Tom Palmer is the author of 48 books. He mainly writes about sports and history. He is the author of three Puffin's football series, Football Academy, Foul Play, and the Squad. He is an advocate for reluctant readers, and works with the National Literacy Trust, the Football Foundation, the Premier League, the Reading Agency, and Barrington Stoke publishers. He was awarded the Ruth Rendell Award for Services to Literacy by the National Literacy Trust. His book Armistice Runner has won the 2019 Children's Book Prize and was shortlisted for the Carnegie Meal. He is a massive football fan.


Visionary Honours Book of the Year, May 2020





ASHA & THE SPIRIT BIRD by Jasbinder Bilan COSTA Book Award, January 2020
