The purpose of the course is to develop Expressive (Fine) Art and Design skills. To gain a National 5 qualification, pupils produce an Expressive Portfolio and a Design Portfolio with the aim of exploring a wide range of materials and techniques. This is in addition to studying a selection of artists and designers' work to inform practical work and to prepare pupils for the written exam. The course offers a chance for pupils to express themselves in a creative way, in a nurturing environment.
