

# **Modern Studies**



National 5 Modern Studies helps pupils understand real-world issues and how decisions made in Scotland, the UK and globally affect their lives. It builds knowledge of politics, law, inequality, and international relations – all through the lens of current events. Pupils learn to form their own views, interpret different sources of information, and communicate effectively. The course encourages debate, independent thinking, and active citizenship. Modern Studies is one of the most up-to-date subjects in school. Pupils are assessed on real issues happening right now – from elections and crime statistics to inequality and global power. Keeping up with the news, recognising bias, and explaining different points of view are all core parts of the course. It helps young people become informed citizens, confident speakers, and thoughtful decision-makers.

20 marks (20% of total grade)

Pupils choose and research a current issue (e.g. policing, poverty, rights in the USA). Pupils gather evidence and write up a structured report under timed conditions.
