Rights Poster Competition

The Rights Respecting Schools steering group have decided to launch a poster competition for all classes to take part in. The task is to make a poster showing children of all backgrounds, abilities, countries, and situations enjoying the same rights — e.g., going to school, having a safe environment, getting healthcare, food, having a voice, exercising their right to play etc. and what having those rights looks like in real life.

This will require some research by pupils online to see to see pictures and text about children around the world enjoying their human rights. The posters can be made on an iPad or on paper. They should be colourful and have drawings and some of the names of the rights on them for those who can write.

There will be two categories for judging, upper and lower school. The winning posters will be displayed on the Rights Respecting Schools Notice Board on the wall at the foot of the stairs and prizes will be given out at assembly. The posters should have the pupil's name and class on the back.

Posters should be submitted to class teachers by the 30th Jan. Winners will be announced at the school assembly and prizes will be awarded.
