Outdoor Learning & PE

In line with advice from the Scottish Government, children will be outside for playtime and lunchtime every day. Can we ask that you send your child to school with a waterproof jacket please?

Children will require **waterproof jackets** for Outdoor Learning, which is timetabled once a week.

PE lessons will continue to take place outside, in all weathers. PE will take place once a week this term. Full PE kit is not required, however if you would like to send your child in with PE kit under school uniform, feel free to do so. Children are required to bring a change of shoes for PE if possible please.

The majority of future communications from the school will now come via e-mail. This is due to a variety of reasons, including the implications on the school budget which is now heavily affected. Please ensure you check your emails on a daily basis for any notifications from the school. P3, P4, P7 Sacraments

The majority of schools and parishes have now been instructed to begin preparation for the celebrations of, Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation.

It is important we are informed of **names of children** who are due to receive one of the above Sacraments, as soon as possible. If you have not received information regarding this, please contact your child's teacher via Seesaw/Showbie or phone the school office.

The celebration of Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation are all dependent upon the numbers permitted to return to church once all churches are re-opened fully.

Drop Off/Pick Up

- P1-P7 pupils should enter and exit the school using the gates previously allocated before Christmas.
- Please **do not** drop children off before 8.45am as there is **no adult presence** before this time in the yard.
- Please remember to observe social distancing and wearing of masks and move away from the gates as quickly as possible.
- One adult **only** for drop off and pick up please.

Breakfast Club/Lunches

Breakfast Club resumes on Monday 15th March

Free school meals are provided for Primary 1-4 pupils. For Primary 5-7 pupils the cost of lunch is still £1.90. At present the school is still not taking monetary payments. The BACS system remains in place and payments are made on a weekly/monthly basis through your bank. Should you require more details regarding BACS payments please phone the school office. Breakfast club is following the same process of BACS. Breakfast club also costs £2.00 per day. With siblings there is a discount.

Wet Mornings

Scottish Government guidance continues to tell us that our children should be out in all weathers.

On occasions of **extremely** wet mornings, pupils will be welcomed into the school when they arrive from 8.45am onwards. Pupils should enter through the doors in the playground and not via the main entrance.
