We are approaching our Christmas break now after an extremely busy term 2. We have had an extremely successful term with every pupil working so hard to improve, expand their knowledge and apply their skills in meaningful situations. Having spoken with every class teacher about each child and analysed their attainment I, with the senior management team are confident that all children are progressing, allowing them to fulfil their potential.

Looking forward, into term 3 we have planned lots of exciting learning ahead. January starts us off with our Scotland focus where different classes will be investigating: Geographical/Parliament/Tourism/Trans-Atlantic & European trade/Scottish music, poetry, dance, traditions/The River Clyde/Monuments to name but a few... We will have our Financial Education week too with the help from the Glasgow Credit Union. Each class will then take on an historical topic in February and information on this will follow in term 3.
