

Celebrating classroom achievements

Each month a curricular area is selected. One pupil from each class will have their work displayed on this wall. This child will be selected by the teacher for improvement in effort or excellent work. Their work is then displayed on the 'Look what we can do' wall.

Another display which celebrates the excellent work our pupils produce is the 'ACE' wall (A Curriculum for Excellence). This is where we display examples of work in which pupils demonstrate one of the 4 capacities—Successful Learner, Responsible Citizen, Effective Contributor and Confident Individual. Pupils fill in a speech bubble next to their piece of work providing an opportunity for pupil voice.

Celebrating Wider Achievements

In St Conval's we also celebrate wider achievements. Pupils are encouraged to bring in any wider achievements eg. Medals/certificates etc. A photo is taken of them and displayed on the St Conval's Superstars Wall.

What does Promoting Positive Relationships look like in our school?

Our School Values

Our policy is to promote **positive** behaviour at all times and build good relationships with the children based on our school values of Openness, Tolerance, Love, Connection, Perseverance, Growth.

Our staff strive to provide a sense of fairness, equality and equity at all times regardless of race, gender or ability.

Every member of school staff awards 'values stickers' to the children when they display a particular value. The school values are also a regular focus of our whole school assemblies.

House Points System

To help promote positive relationships within the school, we operate a house system. The pupils in the school are divided into 4 houses. These are;

Children in the same family are placed in the same house and pupils will remain in the same house throughout their time in St Conval's. There are children all year groups in every house. This house system is based around our school values mentioned previously.

Senior pupils are the house captains of each house. Pupils can receive house value points from any member of staff. At the end of the year the house with the most value points will have their name engraved on a cup and ribbons in their colour will be tied to it which is then displayed at the front foyer of the school.

Pupil of the Week

Class teachers select one pupil each week to be awarded 'Pupil of the Week,' for their hard work, attitude to learning and helpfulness to others. These pupils are then presented with a certificate at assembly. They are also awarded extra House Points for their House. In addition, these pupils also receive a special treat from the Headteacher... An early lunch and an ice lolly! Exciting!



Cool Class Cup

Each week at assembly a class is awarded 'The Cool Class Cup' for their excellent behaviours in and around the school such as lining up, dining hall, going to and from P.E, keeping their classroom/cloakroom tidy etc.
