Since August 2023 the Parent Council has raised £1589 from fundraising activities:

This has been used to fund the following (£1423.34):

- £400 for the Buses for the P7 trip to the Theatre

We have other income from Easy Fundraising and will promote this at the Parents Evening on the Information Stall.

The Parent Council will continue to fundraise for trips, experiences and the P7 ties.

Claire Logue Updated the PC that our time as a nominated group with the Co-op has come to an end and it raised £776.13 this was then added to with £1000 by the Co-op. This was raised on the basis that it would be used for sustainability and outdoor spaces.

Emily will work with School on how this money can be spent.

Head Teacher Update - Provided by Miss Johnston & Miss Lynch

During the recent strike action, the staff took the opportunity to get together and undertake some self-evaluation of how they are delivering the curriculum within the school.

MUGA

Charisse O'Neill updated the PC on discussions with Councillor Siddique.

The issue of the state of repair of the MUGA has been on the Parent Council agenda since 2022, and there have been several email exchanges and visits from GCC and associated departments.

In June 2023 the PC were informed by GCC that there was no funding available for the repair and maintenance of the facility and this would be the case until 2025.

The PC have continued to request support on this issue and councillor Siddique has kept it on her agenda. She is planning a visit with the neighbourhood regeneration department to look at the facilities and decide how she can help us raise awareness of the issues.

These facilities are paramount to the wellbeing of our children with only half the MUGA currently in a useable state.

Miss Johnstone advised the group that NGHA have been contacted and they have committed to removing the trees in the neighbouring properties to prevent the leaves that are falling.

The group discussed raising awareness of the facilities on twitter.
