
Distributed Leadership

- SLT, DLOL and CLOL will regularly reflect on our school's digital journey and how we can continue to plan for the future
- DHT and DLOL will continue to engage in Apple RTC sessions and will share authority level messages and approaches will all staff, pupils and families
- School Improvement Plan Working Parties will identify ways in which digital tools can be used to support and enhance key areas for development

- All staff will regularly utilise GLOW platform and built in collaboration applications such as Microsoft Teams
- Shared Campus GLOW group will be used to store information and resources, share practice and provide opportunities for collaboration
- GLOW Launch Pad will also be used to allow staff to access key authority messages, approaches and support materials from Glasgow's Improvement Challenge
- Learners will have access to their GLOW to support with equitable access to platforms and support with transitions
- Support sessions through face to face workshops and online materials will be provided for learners and families

Professional Dialogue

- Microsoft Team, GLOW Group and Staff
 Meeting 'Shine a Light' used for sharing
 practice and supporting skills development
 through dialogue
- Opportunities for staff to use the POLLI tool to engage in dialogue, particularly around the use of digital tools for planning, learning, teaching and assessment
- Continued self evaluation of impact of particular applications and approaches to supporting learners and families



- Staff library will be regularly updated with both hard copies and QR code texts and articles supporting digital development
- Everyone Can Create and other Apple Books such as Apple Leadership will be used to measure impact, support development and plan for the future



Communication

- WiFi access is available for all staff and learners throughout our campus when using a GCC deployed device
- Our learners, families and staff have access to 6th generation iPads as part of the Connected Learning Glasgow programme
- A STEM room has been organised and resourced for all learners and staff to use
- When planning, purchasing or implementing any interventions, equitable access for learners and families is continually reflected upon

St Martin's Primary Digital Strategy

- 1-2-1 iPads provided for all learners in St Kevin's and 1-2-1 iPads provided for all learners in P6 and P7 in St Stephen's
- Shared iPads have been distributed for P1-5 learners
- Inclusion iPads and MiFi boxes have been distributed to learners who have no access to technology at home
- Our Media Library is timetabled to ensure equitable access for all classes
- Learners have access to a variety of resources to support computational thinking, such as Spheros, Beebots and Robots.

Improve Access

- Using our School App, GLOW Blog and Twitter, we will regularly share updates, foster partnerships and continue to develop our inclusive ethos
- All of St Stephen's and St Kevin's staff and learners will use the Seesaw/Showbie App to communicate with parents, carers and families, distribute home learning activities and keep a digital profile of learners achievements and successes
- We will continue to share our virtual assemblies and develop the use of our school YouTube channel as a way of communication

- iPads will be used across a variety of learning contexts and curricular areas
- The DHT, DLOL and CLOL will work collaboratively to support staff with utilising digital tools
- Applications such as Book Creator, Choice Board and BitsBoard will be used to support learners through the use of visual timetables and to aid communication

Digital Tools

- Our Digital Strategy will be shared with learners, families, staff and other stakeholders
- We will continue to build upon our positive relationships with all families, providing parent/carer workshops to support learning at home and learning for the future
- We will continue to work with parents, carers and families to ensure they are made aware of the technologies we are using to support teaching and learning
- We will continue to provide information for parents, carers and families on Cyber Resilience, Internet Safety and Digital Literacy
- We will offer support for our parents, carers and families to help them support their child with digital learning and in coping with the demands of an evolving digital world





- The Connected Learning Glasgow programme has provided iPads for learners across the school
- Some PEF has been identified and allocated for St Stephen's and St Kevin's to help support digital equity
- All classes will have up to date technology and WiFi as part of the new school development

Digital Leaders of Learning...

- The DHT, DLOL and CLOL will work together to plan and implement activities to enrich and support learning experiences
- All staff will be given the opportunity to train as mentors and be part of the development of training programmes that will be delivered authority wide
- Online support materials such as Teachable courses, DL and CS Framework lessons and West Partnership OS lessons will be shared and used for both learner and staff development
- Pupil Digital Leaders of Learning will take on aspects of leadership across the school. They will support their peers and others through workshops and other learning and teaching experiences
- The pupil DLOLs will also look for ways to foster effective partnerships across their school community

- Tracking conversations, Forward Planning,

- We will continue to ensure ongoing support for all staff through informal drop in sessions, CLPL calendars and online support materials created by our DLOL
- The Quality Assurance calendar will ensure opportunities for sharing practice through trios and the use of the POLLI tool
- People's Views will regularly be gathered to ensure a breadth of support is on offer

- All teaching staff use iPads in their day to day teaching
- An Apple Professional Learning
 Specialist and an Apple Regional
 Trainer are available in school to up-skill staff
- All staff are involved in self evaluation and planning next steps
- Opportunities for creativity and innovativeness using digital technology are alive in teaching and learning experiences

Professional Development

- Opportunities for professional development take the Facts and Story of our learners into consideration
- Pupil Voice is evident and learners have opportunities to share what digital skills they would like to develop
- Support materials for staff are shared and stored in an accessible online platform

Planning

- The DL and CS Framework, along with our school progression pathway will be used to plan for and deliver high quality learning experiences
- Opportunities for dialogue surrounding planning will be provided for staff
- Online support materials such as Apple Books and the DL and CS lessons can be accessed

Assessment

- The Assessment Jigsaw will take into consideration planning, teaching, learning, assessment and support tracking of learners development
- Assessments Frameworks for St Stephen's and St Kevin's take digital assessments into consideration. For example - Standardised (SNSA) and Periodic (SUMDOG)
- Our communication and collaboration apps (Seesaw and Showbie) are used as a digital portfolio of class work and learning at home

Attainment and Achievement

- Learners will continue to work with staff to develop a range of digital skills to support learning
- We will continue to support all learners, particularly those living in SIMD deciles
 1 and 2
- Digital accessibility tools will be used to support learners individuals needs
- Digital resources and tools will be used to support and enhance high quality learning experiences
- Learners achievement will be regularly celebrated through virtual and face to face assemblies and other events

Enhance Curriculum and Assessment Delivery

Local and national level

- The DLOL and DHT will regularly attend DLOL meetings, ensuring key messages are shared with staff, learners and families
- Important messages of development from the Apple Digital Leadership Academy will be shared and taken into consideration when planning for improvement
- There will be attendance and school representation at local and national conferences and events to ensure recent research, key messages and partnerships are embedded

Collaboration

- We will seek opportunities to work in collaboration with schools within and out with our learning community, in order to further refine our digital skills and knowledge
- We will continue to explore further experiences in which we can work with those in our school community and share our digital skills
- Communication through our professional learning networks will allow us to develop further partnership working opportunities

- we will have a relentless focus on digital safety, particularly focusing on keeping ourselves and others safe when using digital tools
- Through partnership working, we will look for opportunities for others to share what they do and how digital skills have supported them in doing so
