

Child Protection means:

- Protecting a child from abuse or neglect
- Abuse or neglect need not have taken place; it is sufficient for a risk assessment to have identified a likelihood of risk of significant harm from abuse or neglect

***"Safeguarding** is a much wider concept than Child Protection and refers to promoting the welfare of children from maltreatment; preventing impairment of children's health or development, ensuring that children are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care, and taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcome."*

What do staff do if they have concerns about a child's welfare or safety?

- Contact the Child Protection Co-ordinator (Mrs McKay) or in the event of her absence, Mrs Gardner/Mrs McEachran
- If all of the SMT (Senior Management Team) are out of the building, staff contact any member of SLT (Senior Leadership Team)
- Any staff member with an issue or concern regarding a child's welfare will discuss it immediately with Mrs McKay/SLT
- St Martin's Child Protection Policy and protocols will be followed to ensure the safety and well-being of the child

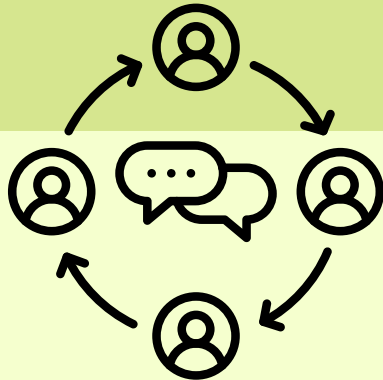


All As One
