Reading

We will continue to develop our reading skills by exploring strategies to use before, during and after reading to support understanding. In class they will continue reading their Story World books to build fluency, sequencing and comprehension. Our class novel that we are reading together is 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. This will provide the children with the opportunity to develop their vocabulary and share their knowledge and understanding of text.

Writing

In writing we will be focussing on Narrative this term. We will be focussing on key features such as characters, settings, plots, problems and resolutions. We will also be developing descriptive language and dialogue to bring their ideas to life.

Listening and Talking

Our class will be using the Diamond Nine exercise to develop decision making, listening and talking skills.

The children will be participating in solo talks about what they have learned from our class topic 'From Farm to Fork'.

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Numeracy and
Maths

Numeracy -In Numeracy, we will be developing our understanding of number processes. We will focus on comparing numbers by using symbols such as less than, greater than and equals to. We will also focus on putting numbers into the correct order according to their place value. We will continue to develop our knowledge and understanding of the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Maths- In maths, we will be exploring measure and information handling. The children will have the opportunity to use a variety of instruments to measure and will record their results. We will also be collecting information using tally marks and will record this information on a bar graph.



In Spanish this term, the children will be learning how to take part in simple, everyday conversations and confidently follow classroom instructions. They will work on developing Spanish listening and talking skills. They will also practice understanding and responding to a variety of friendly greetings with increasing confidence and accuracy.



Health and
Well-being

Our PE days are Monday and Wednesday. Please make sure your child is wearing a comfortable PE kit. They should also bring **soft-soled, non-marking trainers**. This helps to protect the school hall floor and ensures that children have suitable, comfortable footwear for PE activities. They should not wear earrings or any jewellery. In PE, we will be focusing on developing our skills in ball games. This will include practising throwing, catching, bouncing, dribbling, aiming and teamwork skills. We will also work on co-ordination, agility and spatial awareness through a range of fun and engaging team activities.

PATHS lessons will focus on establishing a positive classroom ethos. This will include creating a Class Charter with classroom rules and discussion around our school rules. We will also be learning about feelings and behaviours.



RERC

This term the children will be learning about the Creation story in the Book of Genesis and what it teaches us about God the Creator of the World. We will also be introducing and learning about Laudato Si and the seven goals inspired by Pope Francis. The first two goals we will focus on will be to understand 'Response to the Cry of the Poor' and 'Ecological Spirituality'. Our First Friday mass will resume on Friday the 4th of September.



Life skills

Developing your child's independence and self-care through life skills are very important to us. Please continue to support with some of these suggestions at home:

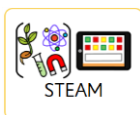
- Practising putting on and taking off coats
- Encouraging your child to zip coats and fasten buttons
- Support them in packing their own school bag
- Practise opening lunch boxes and snack containers
- Encourage them to look after their belongings



Expressive Arts

Dance -The children will be working with a dance specialist from Determined to Dance. They will work together to choreograph a series of movements which they will then put into a sequence. They will have the opportunity to perform their dance in front of an audience.

Art – The children will be exploring printing using vegetables. Learners will use potatoes, carrots, onions and other vegetables to create repeated patterns.



STEAM

Learners will use a range of simple food preparation techniques to make pizza bagels. The class will grow their own fresh basil to use as a topping on their pizza.

The children will learn how to use a range of cooking utensils safely.

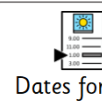
