- A specific incident you see or hear about.
- A disclosure made by a young person or carer.
- Information from a third party.
- Adult behaviour or circumstances that may place a young person at risk of harm.
- A young person's behaviour or circumstances that may place the young person at risk of harm.
- A variety of minor incidents which put together give rise to concern.

WHAT TO DO:

- Complete a copy of MC-57- Appendix 3 (Record of Concern) as soon as possible and hand to a CRC.
- Be sure to speak to your CPC officer if you need any further support.
- Situations like this can at times, be emotionally distressing. Please speak to a CPC if needed.
