- School begins everyday at 8.45am.
- Interval lasts a duration of 15 minutes and lunch lasts for 40 minutes.
- We have two short days and three long days.
- On Tuesdays and Friday school finishes at 2.40pm and on the other days 3.30pm

TRAVEL TO SCHOOL

- At St Thomas Aquinas we have a number of school buses; if you believe your child qualifies for a bus pass you must complete the online form which can be found on Glasgow City Council's website.
- No child can travel on the school buses until they have been granted a place by Glasgow City Council's Transport Unit.
- Please ensure your child knows how to travel to and from school independently and please re-iterate road safety advice to help keep them safe and concentrating when crossing the very busy roads near our school.
- All pupils are expected to demonstrate the same high level of behaviour on their way to and from school as they do in school. Any acts which fall below an acceptable standard may result in school disciplinary action being taken and Police Scotland involvement.



SUPPORTING STUDENTS IN STA

- We have Student Support Team within school which comprises of Six Principal Teachers of Pastoral Care (PTPC)
 - A Principal Teacher of Support for Learning
 - Support for Learning Workers
 - Family Liaison Officer
 - MCR Mentoring Co-ordinator
 - Family Engagement Officer via Action for Children
- House system led by PTPC siblings will be kept in the same house
- Universal support for all pupils via PSE and planned activities.
- * Targeted support when needed managed by PTPC and PT SfL.



SOCIAL MEDIA

- ❖ If your child has social media accounts please monitor this regularly.
- Online safety is discussed during PSE lessons but please also discuss this with your child.
- Please closely monitor your child's online behaviours to ensure they are appropriate and they are being kind to others.
- Making threats or sharing inappropriate material online can be serious criminal offences and may be reported to Police Scotland.
- Experience has shown us that many negative school incidents are as a direct result of social media or gaming disputes which take place outside of school.
