Attendance is a priority for Glasgow City Council and for St. Paul's Learning Community. Please see the infographic attached to the email with this newsletter which has been produced to encourage attendance at school everyday.

We understand that there are occasions where your child will be too unwell to attend school but it is important that absences are reported using the Pupil Absence Line (details in opposite column).

The council's target for attendance is 95% and our school attendance rate is currently 90.2% with 107 of our children having an absence rate of over 10% already this session. Let's work together to improve these statistics and give our children every opportunity to thrive and learn at school!
