

## It's Christmas

Our countdown to Christmas is officially on. The weather outside may be frightful, but our Christmas celebrations are delightful! Our festive schedule is now in full swing, and remaining key dates can be found at the end of this newsletter.

As we approach the end of 2023 it is a good time to reflect on all that we have achieved this year so far. As you know our missions for this session are to improve numeracy, writing and approaches to health and wellbeing across the school and to work in partnership with all stakeholders across our leaning community. Our Challenge Leaders of Learning have been working with targeted intervention groups who are making very good progress in both literacy and numeracy. We now have three nurture trained staff who are helping to enhance nurturing approaches to teaching and learning across the school. We have introduced emotional check ins in all classes and are using the Circles Participation Framework to ensure our classrooms are inclusive for all. We also led and engaged in a very successful learning community inclusion event in October that has developed practitioner knowledge and practice to support staff to get it right for all of our young people. Additionally, we have worked really hard to gather and act on feedback from families which has resulted in increased after/before school clubs for pupils, more educational experiences such as trips for all classes and an enhanced focus on the issues families have concerns about such as the capacity of the school and the carpark/drop off zone.



#### **Mobile Phone Policy**

It has been brought to our attention that some children in P5-7 are not following our *Acceptable Use of Digital Technology* policy and are using mobile phones in unsafe ways during the school day. Whilst we understand the need for children to have access to phones as they make their way to and from school, there is no need for them to be accessed during the school day. Previously phones brought to school could be kept switched off in school bags. We have since liaised with GCC, other schools in the learning community and beyond and have implemented a new process to ensure the safety of all. Mobile phones will be collected in of a morning during registration and will be stored <u>securely</u> in classrooms until the end of the day. As part of our Health and Wellbeing and Anti-Bullying programmes we will continue to educate pupils about the safe use of digital devices. Thank you for your support and cooperation on this matter. We really appreciate the valued relationship between school and home to keep all of our children and personal devices safe.

#### **Attendance & Engagement**

Wallacewell Primary are passionate about getting it right for the pupils we work with. In order for us to meet learners needs we require pupils to be in school on time each day. In Glasgow when a child's attendance falls below 95%, this becomes a concern for the school. We will follow the council and school procedures for managing attendance to support our families to ensure children attend school, on time, each day. Last month we will be starting to issue families with letters, as per the council policy, if pupils attendance has become a cause for concern. In January we will review attendance again and will send out further correspondence where attendance continues to be a concern.

#### **Physical Education Reminder**

As per Glasgow City Council policy, no jewellery is allowed to be worn during PE lessons, such as gym sessions, dance workshops and swimming lessons. This includes, but is not limited to:

- bracelets
- necklaces
- earrings
- · nose-piercings

All jewellery needs to be removed before taking part in taught physical activities. This rule applies to boys and girls. We recommend that families take children to get ears etc pierced during the Summer break to allow ample healing time, 6 weeks, so that earrings can then be removed for PE. Glasgow's full Health and Safety document for physical activity can be viewed by scanning the QR code.

#### **Consultation With Families**

Thank you to all families who have attended family learning and engagement sessions over the last two terms. We appreciated the time parents and carers have taken out of their busy days to attend. Listening to feedback gathered over terms 1 and 2, we are going to try to facilitate some more evening family learning sessions to allow more families to engage. We were delighted with the feedback we received at our recent Parents Evenings. Our staff, who all work very hard to get it right for our young people, love to hear your positive comments and praise.

In terms of next steps, some feedback was given about the frequency of emails from the school. Families unanimously asked for more and better communication at the end of last academic session. We are a large school and that combined with a request for more and better communication naturally comes an increase correspondence. We will however endeavour to condense as much correspondence as possible. Unfortunately, text messaging is not a method of communication we are able to use. We would however encourage families to download the Groupcall Xpressions app where we can send messages, in text form, in addition to emails at no cost to the school.

#### **Extra Curricular Activities Reminder**

#### You asked and we have delivered - more extra curricular activities at Wallacewell!

In term 2 we introduced more morning and after school clubs. We targeted the upper and middle school and next term will focus more on our lower school pupils. Following feedback from families we also plan to introduce a STEM afterschool club. More info will follow about this in the New Year.

#### **Reporting Absence**

#### How to report your child absent from school:

You should call the Pupil Absence Reporting (PAR) Team on: 0141 287 0039 to report your child absent from school. You can call the line every school day from 8:00am. You should call the absence reporting line before 9.30am on the first day of your child's absence.

Please do not use Groupcall to report your child's absence as this may not be seen by school staff and is not GCC protocol for reporting absence.

#### The Pupil Absence Reporting (PAR) team:

The Pupil Absence Reporting (PAR) service is provided by a dedicated team of experienced Education support staff. The information you provide to the team is updated in the school's system when you call, so the school is immediately aware of all absence information.

The Pupil Absence Reporting (PAR) service has been created to provide an efficient flexible way for parents/carers to report absence. We recognise that in some circumstances, for example, to report or discuss a sensitive issue, you may still require to speak directly with the school. The following guidance should be applied:

#### Please phone the PAR team to report the following absences:

Sickness absence: if the absence lasts more than one day, parents and carers are required to call on subsequent days to provide an update. A letter should be provided to the school when the child returns from their absence.

Medical or dental appointments: Parents and carers should call the team to report absences for medical or dental appointments. The school requires a letter or appointment card as evidence of the appointment to ensure permission is given to be absent from class.

#### Please phone the school directly to report the following absences:

To make sure you receive the right support you require, parents and carers should still contact the school directly to report absences of a sensitive or personal nature, for example:


Bereavement

Serious illness, for example, an absence which is going to last more than one week

Injury, for example, broken limb

Contagious diseases or illness
