

### **FREE SCHOOL MEALS (FSM) - APPEAL**

We are aware that many of our families who are entitled to the support of FSM have not yet signed up. For many families this may be because their child in in Primary 1-5 and free school meals are provided as standard for all pupils at these stages. However, we would like to remind families that applying for the free Meal/Breakfast Club grant also comes with many other benefits for families and *the school*—

- Pupils in receipt of FSM can access Breakfast club free of charge where pupils are provided with a full breakfast and have the opportunity to socialise and play with friends.
- Pupils in receipt of FSM also benefit from the School Clothing Grant award of £120 for a Primary aged child or £150 for a Secondary aged child. This is available on an annual basis to assist with the cost of purchasing essential school clothing.
- Our schools FSM allocation percentage also impacts on funding and staffing for our school. Higher FSM
  allocation percentages can result in increased staffing levels and more funding for our school.

We would like to encourage all of our families who believe they may be entitled to the free School Meal/Breakfast Club and Clothing grant to apply. ## **Health and Wellbeing**

**INDOOR SHOES**— For health and safety reasons children **MUST** bring a change of shoes to school. We call these indoor shoes. These can be kept in school or brought in each day but **MUST** be changed into each day whilst in school buildings. Children will change in and out of these shoes throughout the day and will wear their *outdoor* shoes at playtime/lunchtime. This helps to keep our school clean, tidy and free dog mess which unfortunately at times seems to litter surrounding streets. Please help us to keep everyone safe and keep our school clean and tidy by ensuring your child has a change of shoes in school each day. Thank you.

PE KITS— We are seeing an increase in the number of children not bringing PE Kit to school. We have started to issue letters via Groupcall to make parents/carers aware, as we know that some of our printed letters have not made their way home to parents/carers. Gym kits are required for health and safety reasons. Physical education is an entitlement of all children and as such, teachers at Wallacewell Primary plan for 2 hours of quality PE each week.

As per Glasgow City Council policy, no jewellery is allowed to be worn during PE lessons, such as gym sessions, dance workshops and swimming lessons. Please scan the QR for further information on the policy. Jewellery includes, but is not limited to:

- bracelets
- necklaces
- earrings
- nose-piercings

All jewellery needs to be removed before taking part in taught physical activities. This rule applies to boys and girls.

## **Attendance & Engagement**

You should call the Pupil Absence Reporting (PAR) Team on: 0141 287 0039 to report your child absent from school. You can call the line every school day from 8:00am. You should call the absence reporting line before 9.30am on the first day of your child's absence.

Please do not use Groupcall to report your child's absence as this may not be seen by school staff and is not GCC protocol for reporting absence.

# **Partnership Working**

As you will know, we are passionate about working together to get it right for our young people and their families. Through self-evaluation we have identified that we would like to work more closely with external partners to enhance the learning opportunities for our pupils. We are delighted to share that this month we have extended our partnership working by linking with <u>Cedar Project</u>.

Cedar (Children Experiencing Domestic Abuse Recovery) is a unique way of working with children, young people and their mothers who have experienced domestic abuse. The Cedar programme takes place over 12 sessions with groups for children, young people and their mothers running in parallel. The groups provide an opportunity to explore the experiences, understanding and feelings with an emphasis on providing fun and creative activities that keep children engaged and interacting with each other. It is about creating a safe place for children and their mothers to help each other to find the best strategies to deal with their experiences and rebuild their lives. A key aim of the programme is to help mothers to support their children in their recovery.




