Welcome to Term 4, and the final push before the summer holidays! Longer days and brighter skies are certainly putting a spring in our step! Unfortunately, there is a bit of gloom on the horizon. You will have seen the headlines about the devastating cuts to education in Glasgow. While we are still waiting to see how this affects us directly at Wallacewell, it is safe to say there will be fewer staff and less money available. Across the city, 172 teachers are being lost (and that is just the beginning). Our Parent Council have been working hard on a campaign for all families to voice their concerns, and we strongly encourage everyone to get involved with the work of our Parent Council. Our promise at Wallacewell Primary to you is that we will continue to provide the best learning experiences and environment we possibly can for our young people, with the resources we have. We simply ask for your patience and understanding as we navigate any changes ahead.

In nicer news, we are looking forward to our summer trips to Blair Drummond Safari Park! We have been able to arrange for this trip at no cost to families. We are also delighted to share that we have been successful in securing places for our Primary 6 pupils on a new pilot programme - Glasgow's Urban Adventure Award. Our young people will each benefit from 3 full days at Pinkston Basin between now and the end of term. The children in Primary 6 worked exceptionally hard last term to raise just over $£ 500$ as part of their enterprise project. This money will be used to partly fund this experience, which costs $£ 30$ per head, not including the cost of the buses. The school will cover the remaining cost of the experience. We are also looking forward to our first Houses Sports Day on Monday the 3rd of June 2024.

## FREE SCHOOL MEALS (FSM) - APPEAL

We are aware that many of our families who are entitled to the support of FSM have still not yet signed up. For many families this may be because their child in in Primary 1-5 and free school meals are provided as standard for all pupils at these stages. However, we would like to remind families that applying for the free Meal/Breakfast Club grant also comes with many other benefits for families and the school-

- $\quad$ Pupils in receipt of FSM can access Breakfast club free of charge where pupils are provided with a full breakfast and have the opportunity to socialise and play with friends.
- Pupils in receipt of FSM also benefit from the School Clothing Grant award of $£ 120$ for a Primary aged child or $£ 150$ for a Secondary aged child. This is available on an annual basis to assist with the cost of purchasing essential school clothing.
- Our schools FSM allocation percentage also impacts on funding and staffing for our school. Higher FSM allocation percentages can result in increased staffing levels and more funding for our school.

We would like to encourage all of our families who believe they may be entitled to the free School Meal/Breakfast Club and Clothing grant to apply. ## Pupil Equity Fund and Poverty in Glasgow

As most of our families will know the Pupil Equity Funding is money that comes to our school to help us to provide the best possible opportunities for our children's learning. In particular, it is there to help the school support children who experience barriers to learning and who might be falling behind or not getting the same chances in their education because their family is experiencing poverty or other financial difficulties. This money is given to our school as part of the Scottish Government's Scottish Attainment Challenge.

Over 31\% of children within our school live in the most deprived areas in Scotland according to the latest school roll measured against the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (GCC, Focus Tool). Over 25\% of pupils are registered for free school meals and over 23\% have English as an Additional Language.

To help our families understand poverty in Glasgow we have included two infographics in this months newsletter from Glasgow's Local Child Poverty Action Report 2022/23.
