

Dear Families,

As we approach the final week of the school year, there are a few important updates to let you know about. Starting with the nicer news... All pupils had the opportunity to attend one of our trips to Blair Drummond Safari Park this term. Everyone had a lovely day out. Children have taken part in a variety of educational experiences this session and we remain committed to enhancing these experiences further next session. We also had a fantastic House Sports Day this month. The winning house will be announced next week. We looking forward to the different activities we have planned between now and the end of the session.

And now the less pleasant part... In our last newsletter, we mentioned the cuts being made to education services in Glasgow. Thank you to everyone who sent letters prepared by our Parent Council in protest. These cuts have serious implications for schools across the city, but some specific consequences for Wallacewell Primary next year will include:

- Reduced amount of literacy and numeracy support including Dyslexia identification
- Limited after-school clubs
- Reduced supervision in playground and in the lunch hall
- Fewer opportunities for showcase learning, family learning and engagement with parents
- Reduction in our Soft Start offer

However, our promise to you is that we will carry on working hard and doing our best to provide quality learning experiences and a welcoming environment for our young people. Your patience and understanding as we navigate new and unprecedented challenges will be very much appreciated.

Teacher numbers for next year are settled, and we can confirm that despite an increase in school role next year, we will have the equivalent of just over 1½ fewer teachers next session as a result of the budget cuts. We are currently working on class allocations for next session and hope to have teacher names to you soon.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our parent volunteers from this session who have supported us with a variety of activities including school trips and paired reading. The support of our families is very much valued and appreciated.

All that is left for me to do is wish you all a restful and relaxing summer break.

I will look forward to seeing everyone back to school in August.

Staffing Update

There have been some big changes in terms of staffing this term at Wallacewell Primary. Three of our Support for Learning Workers, Mrs Cody, Mrs McElwain and Mrs Corrigan, left in May for pastures new. They will be greatly missed, and we thank them all for their hard work and support during their time with us. Please note: We have not been allocated replacements our SfLWs who have left, meaning our SfLW allocation have been stretched even further this term. We hope to be able to recruit for these vacancies next session.

Two of our Class Teachers also left in May. Mrs Souter has left to take up a new post within the Tourism industry. We wish her every success in her new role. Ms Wilson also started her maternity leave. We are delighted to share that Ms Wilson welcomed a beautiful baby girl into the world earlier this month. We cannot wait to meet her. Ms Wilson will return to Wallacewell when her maternity leave ends.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS (FSM) - APPEAL

We are aware that many of our families who are entitled to the support of FSM have still not yet signed up. For many families this may be because their child in in Primary 1-5 and free school meals are provided as standard for all pupils at these stages. However, we would like to remind families that applying for the free Meal/Breakfast Club grant also comes with many other benefits for families and *the school*—

- Pupils in receipt of FSM can access Breakfast club free of charge where pupils are provided with a full breakfast and have the opportunity to socialise and play with friends.
- Pupils in receipt of FSM also benefit from the School Clothing Grant award of £120 for a Primary aged child or £150 for a Secondary aged child. This is available on an annual basis to assist with the cost of purchasing essential school clothing.
- Our schools FSM allocation percentage also impacts on funding and staffing for our school. Higher FSM
 allocation percentages can result in increased staffing levels and more funding for our school.

We would like to encourage all of our families who believe they may be entitled to the free School Meal/Breakfast Club and Clothing grant to apply. 
