

Teaching Staff—Session 2025/26

As we progress towards Term 4, we are looking ahead at next session, specifically classes and our allocation of teachers. As you will be aware all schools in Glasgow were impacted by the budget cuts last session. As a result of the budget cuts, there was a hold on the recruitment of teachers across the city, meaning any permanent positions were not filled on a permanent basis. For next session the plan is for all permanent positions to be filled. Glasgow's Human Resources (HR) Department are currently working on this as part of the annual staffing exercise. So how does this impact Wallacewell Primary? Next session we have 6 permanent posts to fill. These posts are available as a result of teachers retiring or moving onto new posts, including promoted posts, within education. We also have 4 temporary posts to fill. These are mainly as a result of maternity leaves. What this means for us is that we will not be in a position to confirm class teachers for next session until we know who our new staff are. It is our hope that we will know all of our permanent teachers by the beginning of June 2025. However we may not know who our temporary teachers are until August 2025. Therefore we may not be in a position to inform families about class teachers prior to finishing for the Summer Break. We understand this may be worrying for parents/carers, but we would like to reassure you all that we will do our very best to ensure that transitions to the next stage in school will be as smooth as possible for all of our children. We would also like to take this opportunity to remind families, that whilst this may be frustrating for some, it is a process that is completely out with the hands of the school. We are as keen to find out who our new staff are as families are, and as such we are in regular communication with GCC's Education HR Team.

Communication with Families

At Wallacewell Primary we pride ourselves on having very good communication with our families. We know that working together can help to improve outcomes for our young people. However, this year our staffing has been impacted negatively as a result of the budget cuts. Both Depute Head Teachers have a significant class commitment this year meaning they are less available to speak to parents/carers. The whole Management Team, including the Head Teacher, are also required on the floor on a daily basis to support the inclusion needs of our children. Despite these challenges, we work hard to maintain high levels of contact with families and will continue to do so in order to get it right for our young people. However we would like to remind our families that we are not always available to speak to parents/carers immediately, meet with families on specific days/times or respond to phone calls or emails of the day that these are received. We will however always respond to families as soon as we possibly can.

Head Lice

Please remember to take the sensible precaution of regularly checking your child's hair for any signs of head lice infection. It is important that children's hair is checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and to prevent them from spreading.

Please follow the simple routine below to ensure that we can keep any head lice outbreaks to a minimum -

- Check your child's hair once a week
- Use a proper detection comb
- If you find live lice, consult a pharmacist for treatment advice immediately
- If head lice are detected please check the rest of family

Mobile Phones

As per School Policy, any pupil bringing a mobile phone to school should hand it in to their class box at the beginning of the day. This is then sent to the office to ensure devices are stored securely until home-time. This ensures the safe keeping of devices and avoids any unnecessary issues with the use of mobile devices during the school day.

Please remember that the majority of social media apps, including Whatsapp, are not supposed to be used by anyone under the age of 13. The amount of problems being caused by inappropriate comments and conversations amongst young people is increasing, and we just ask that everyone is mindful of what children are doing on their devices.




Vandalism

Now for something less positive... In recent weeks we have been experiencing vandalism in our pupil toilets. This includes the boys and girls facilities. The vandalism has included:

- Deliberate blocking of sinks with tissues, and taps left running
- Deliberate blocking of urinals, so when the automatic flush kicks in, they flood over
- Stuffing of tissues down the toilet pans

We will never prevent any pupil from using a bathroom. It is a human right. However, there are times when some of the facilities simply cannot be used because of what has happened. The time and cost implications of managing these events is huge, and it cannot continue. We have discussed these issues with classes in school, but we would ask that you reinforce the message at home: no school property should be deliberately damaged or destroyed.

Physical Education Reminder

As per Glasgow City Council policy, no jewellery is allowed to be worn during PE lessons, such as gym sessions, dance workshops and swimming lessons. This includes, but is not limited to bracelets, necklaces, earrings and nose-piercings

All jewellery <u>must</u> be removed before taking part in taught physical activities. This rule applies to boys and girls. We recommend that families take children to get ears etc pierced during the Summer break to allow ample healing time, 6 weeks, so that earrings can then be removed for PE. Glasgow's full Health and Safety document for physical activity can be viewed by scanning the QR code below.

In order to help keep our school clean and safe for all, children <u>must</u> bring a change of shoes (indoor shoes) to school. As a result of the unpredictable Scottish weather our playground and the surrounding streets/pavements are often dirty or muddy. Children are trailing this dirt into the school and onto carpets /flooring which is unsightly, dirty and unsafe.

Please ensure you child has a change of shoes (indoor shoes) for school that will be kept in school.

School Uniform

We are very proud of our school uniform at Wallacewell Primary School. School uniform plays a key role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging within the school community. We encourage all of our pupils to adhere to our dress code.

<u>Unacceptable Dress</u> – There are forms of dress that are unacceptable in school, such as items of clothing which:

- Potentially encourage factions (such as football colours/kits)
- Could cause offence (such as anti-religious symbolism or political slogans)
- Could cause health and safety difficulties (such as loose fitting clothing, jewellery)
- Could cause damage to flooring
- Carry advertising particularly for alcohol or tobacco
- Could be used to inflict damage on other pupils

Please note acrylic nails should not be worn to school as the present a health and safety risk in PE. Children with acrylic nails will be unable to participate in PE as per Glasgow City Council procedures.
