


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

Dear Families,

As we approach the final weeks of the school year, it is a good time to reflect on some of our schools amazing achievements over the last academic session. These have included—

- *achieving our Silver Rights Respecting Schools Award*
- *our community work being recognised by the Glasgow Trades House*
- *the installation of our school community defibrillator*
- *the creation of our Bothy*
- *the successful implementation of our Wellbeing Room (The Well) that supports 55 children each week to meet their health & wellbeing needs*
- *improved whole school attendance, in comparison to last session (2023-24)*

A full overview our successes and next steps will be published in our annual *Standards and Quality Report (SQR)* in September 2025.

As you will know, we were impacted negatively by the budgets cuts made to education services in Glasgow this year. These cuts have had serious implications for schools across the city, but some specific consequences for Wallacewell Primary this year included—

- a reduction in literacy and numeracy support including Dyslexia identification
- limited after-school clubs
- fewer opportunities for showcase learning, family learning and engagement with parents

Despite the challenges, we have remained committed to providing the best possible service to support us to meet the needs of the young people we serve. Our promise to our families is and always will be, that we will carry on working hard and doing our best to provide quality learning experiences, in a welcoming environment, to get it right for our young people. Your patience and understanding as we continue to navigate new and unprecedented challenges is very much appreciated.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our parent volunteers from this session who have supported us with a variety of activities including school trips and paired reading. The support of our families is very much valued and appreciated.

All that is left for me to do is wish you all a restful and relaxing summer break. I will look forward to seeing everyone back to school in August. Teachers will return on Tuesday the 12th of August 2025. Pupils will return on Thursday the 14th of August 2025.




Fond Farewells

Physical Education Reminder

As per Glasgow City Council policy, no jewellery is allowed to be worn during PE lessons, such as gym sessions, dance workshops and swimming lessons. This includes, but is not limited to bracelets, necklaces, earrings and nose-piercings

All jewellery **must** be removed before taking part in taught physical activities. This rule applies to boys and girls. **We recommend that families take children to get ears etc pierced during the Summer break to allow ample healing time, 6 weeks, so that earrings can then be removed for PE.** Glasgow's full Health and Safety document for physical activity can be viewed by scanning the QR code below.

*In order to help keep our school clean and safe for all, children **must** bring a change of shoes (indoor shoes) to school. As a result of the unpredictable Scottish weather our playground and the surrounding streets/pavements are often dirty or muddy. Children are trailing this dirt into the school and onto carpets /flooring which is unsightly, dirty and unsafe.*

For next session please ensure you child has a change of shoes (indoor shoes) for school that will be kept in the school building. Thank you in advance.



School Uniform—Reminders for Next Session

We are very proud of our school uniform at Wallacewell Primary School. School uniform plays a key role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging within the school community. We encourage all of our pupils to adhere to our dress code.

Unacceptable Dress – There are forms of dress that are unacceptable in school, such as items of clothing which:

- Potentially encourage factions (such as football colours/kits)
- Could cause offence (such as anti-religious symbolism or political slogans)
- Could cause health and safety difficulties (such as loose fitting clothing, jewellery)
- Could cause damage to flooring
- Carry advertising particularly for alcohol or tobacco
- Could be used to inflict damage on other pupils

Please note acrylic nails should not be worn to school as the present a health and safety risk in PE. Children with acrylic nails will be unable to participate in PE as per Glasgow City Council procedures.
