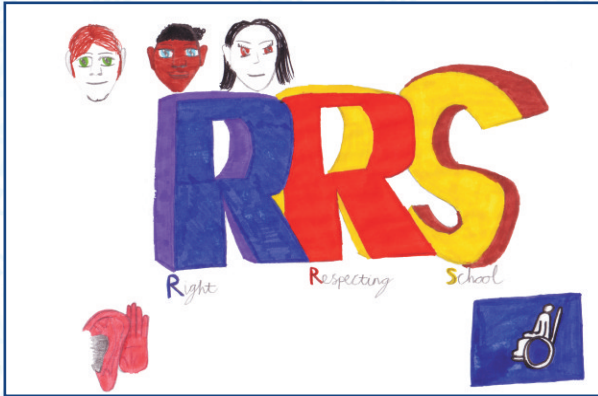

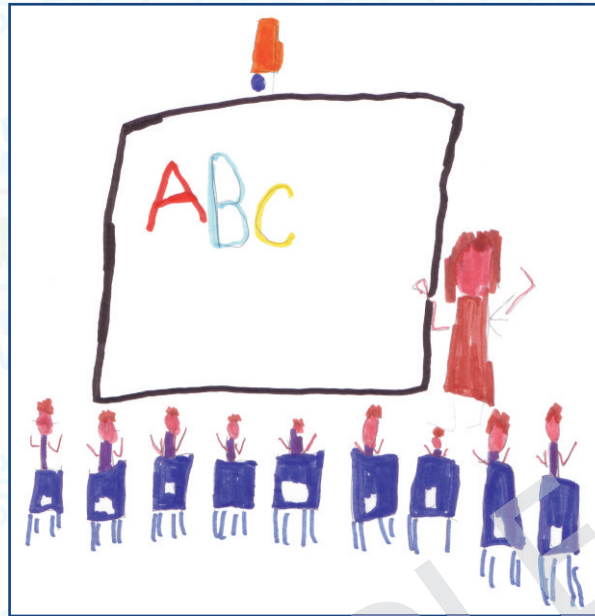

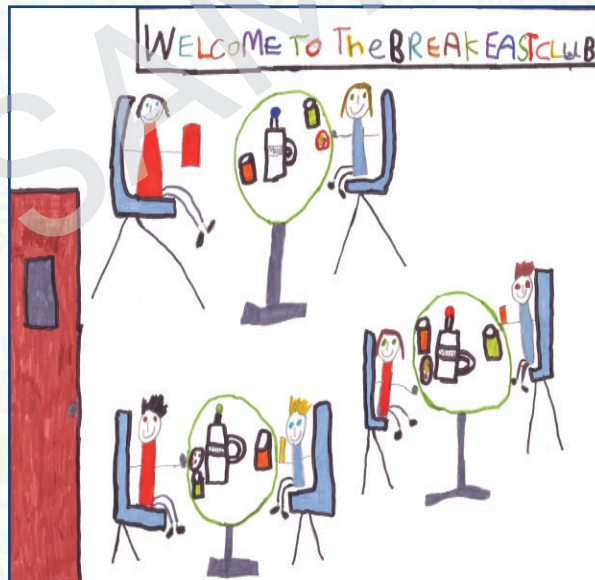
Article 2 - Picture by George, S5

Children have the right to say what they think should happen and to have their views taken seriously.



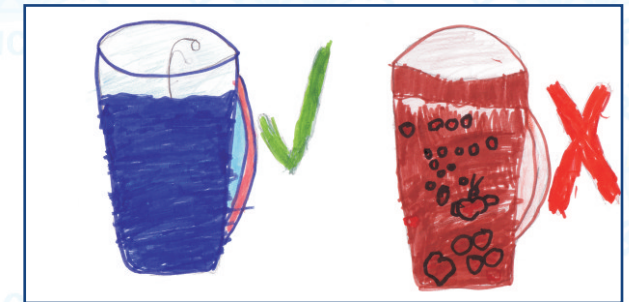
Article 13 - Picture by John, Primary 5/6
