

Groups larger than 40 can split into a second hour and can book a ranger tour of the surrounding country park. The visit includes a guided tour around the Castle, the ancestral

home of the Boyd Family. Replicas for handling and trying on are available, plus displays of arms and armour, early musical instruments and tapestries. The Countryside Rangers tours provide fun environmental education focusing on projects and activities which encourage personal, social and community education and have been designed in line with the Curriculum for Excellence.
